This Petition, coming on 23.12.2025, for hearing before me in the presence of Sri.B.Sulochana, Advocate for the Petitioners and upon hearing the Arguments and upon perusing the material available on record, and having been stood over for consideration till this day, this Court made the following:

ORDER

1. This petition is filed under Section 13-B of Hindu Marriage Act seeking divorce by mutual consent.

2. ***Briefly, the averments of petition are that :-*** The marriage of both petitioners was solemnized on 24.03.2024 at Thota Kalyana Mandapam, Mannur, Rajampet town, as per Hindu Rites and customs in the presence of elders of both parties. Immediately after the marriage 1st petitioner joined with

the 2nd petitioner at his house and both of them lead happy marital life for few days only. Subsequently there arose differences between both the petitioners. Due to the wedlock, they have no issues. Further, both petitioners have no interest on marital life and there is no affection between each other. Both petitioners are unable to continue marital life with each other. There is no possibility for restitution of marital life between both the petitioners. Both petitioners are living separately since more than one year. Several mediations took place for reunion of both petitioners, but invain. After their marriage, the marriage has broke down irretrievably. The petitioners therefore entitled to seek a decree of divorce for dissolution of their marriage under the Hindu Marriage Act. Hence, the petition for divorce on mutual consent.

3. Both the Petitioner No.1 and 2 were examined as P.W.1 and P.W.2 and got marked Exs.P1 to Ex.P6.

4. Heard the learned Counsel for Petitioners.

5. Now the Point for consideration is :

“Whether the Petitioners are entitled for decree of divorce on mutual consent ?”

6. **POINT :**

Both the petitioner No.1 and 2 are examined as P.w.1 and P.w.2 respectively, to prove their case. They filed affidavits in lieu of their examinations-in-chief mostly reiterating the averments of their petition.

Further, the contentions stated in the chief affidavits of said witnesses are also appear to be similar.

7. As seen from the evidence of the P.w.1 and P.w.2 coupled with the averments of the petition, it is proved that both the petitioners being married as per Hindu Rites and Customs and since one year they deserted with each other and are living separately. Further, the material on record proved that their matrimonial issues could not be solved inspite of efforts before the elders and finally in the stage of irretrievable break down of the matrimonial relation, they have jointly filed present petition to have divorce on mutual consent to lead their independent lives. Instead of living together with irretrievable disputes, the petitioners can have opportunity to lead their further independent lives, if they are granted the decree of divorce, as prayed by them. Hence, keeping in view the better future of the petitioners, this Court inclined to allow the petition. Accordingly the point is answered in favour of the petitioners.

8. In the result, the petition is allowed dissolving the marriage of petitioners that took place on 24.03.2024, by granting decree of divorce by mutual consent. Both parties shall bear their own costs.
