ORDER:

1) Record received. Heard. It is mentioned in the instant bail application that accused/ applicant has been falsely implicated in this case. It is further averred that nothing has been recovered from the accused/ applicant and the alleged recovery has been planted on the accused/ applicant. It is further averred that presentation of challan and conclusion of trial will take long time and no useful purpose would be served by detaining the applicant in custody. Hence, it is prayed that applicant/accused may kindly be released on bail.

2) Learned counsel for the applicant/accused while arguing in the lines of bail application contended that same may be allowed.

3) Conversely, learned Additional Public Prosecutor for the State contended that there are serious allegations against the applicant/accused and therefore, bail application may be dismissed.

4) After hearing rival submissions, it has transpired that instant case FIR was registered when on 17.04.2026, accused/ applicant alongwith was apprehended and from him, 20 loose intoxicant tablets were recovered. Chemical Examiner report is yet to be received. Investigating Officer has stated that the report of Chemical Examiner has not been received so far. The applicant is in custody since 17.04.2026. Hon'ble Punjab and Haryana High Court in **Inderjit Singh @ Laddy vs State of Punjab 2014(3)-RCR (Criminal)-page 952**, has been pleased to hold that if matter is being unnecessarily delayed due to non-receipt of FSL Report, Special Court may release applicant-accused on interim bail till receipt of report of chemical examiner.

5) Hence, until the report of Chemical Examiner is received, it cannot be ascertained as to whether the recovery effected from applicant falls within the commercial quantity or non-commercial. The receipt of report of Chemical Examiner will take sufficient long time, so no useful purpose would be served by keeping the accused in custody for an indefinite period. Consequently, without expressing opinion upon the merits of the case, in the light of above discussed law, applicant/ accused is ordered to be released on **interim bail** till the receipt of report of Chemical Examiner, on his furnishing bail bonds to the satisfaction of Illaqa/Duty Magistrate with the condition that applicant/ accused will

neither leave the country without prior permission of the Court nor she will tamper with the witnesses of the prosecution and he will appear before the learned trial Court on each and every date of hearing. **In case, on receipt of FSL report, it is found that the alleged contraband recovered from the accused is of commercial quantity, then this bail order shall be deemed to be cancelled.** A copy of this order be sent to the Ld.Illaq Magistrate for compliance. Bail application file be attached with remand papers/ main file.
