ORDER

1. This order of mine shall dispose of the bail application filed by applicant-accused under Section 482(i) Bhartiya Nagrik Suraksha Sanhita in case FIR No.31 dated 28-04-2025, under Sections 115(2), 191(3), 190, 304(2) and 62 of the Bhartiya Nyaya Sanhita and offence under Section 117(2) of the BNS added lateron, registered at Police Station Arif Ke.
2. Notice of the bail application was given to the Ld. Additional Public Prosecutor for the State and police record has also been requisitioned.

3. I have heard learned counsel for the applicant-accused and learned Addl. Public Prosecutor for the State and have gone through the police record very carefully.

4. Learned counsel for the applicant-accused has contended that the applicant-accused is innocent person and has been falsely implicated in the present case. There is unexplained delay of six days in lodging the FIR. The applicant-accused allegedly shown to be armed with kappa and only simple injury has been attributed to him. He himself received injuries at the hands of the complainant party and his MLR was also conducted, but, the police has not registered any case. The police is raiding at the house of the applicant-accused. He is ready to join the investigation. Hence, a prayer has been made to admit the applicant-accused to interim anticipatory bail.

5. The Ld. Addl. Public Prosecutor for the State, on the other hand, has opposed the bail application by submitting that the FIR has been registered on the statement of complainant Hardeep Singh son of Partap Singh with the allegations that on 22-4-2025 he along with his nephew Sartaj Singh on his motorcycle has gone to the shop of Sarwan situated at village Attari for purchasing meat. He has gone inside the shop for purchasing meat and his nephew was sitting on the motorcycle outside the shop. After about 20-25 minutes, when he came outside the shop and saw that Vijay son of Ramesh armed with kappa, Batti son of unknown armed with kappa, Jugraj Singh son of Jagga Singh, Jinder son of unknown empty handed and Akashdeep son of Ranga Singh and Hardev Singh son of unknown armed with dangs were making altercation with his nephew

and tried to snatch the motorcycle. When his nephew resisted them, then Vijay gave a reverse blow of his kappa to his nephew, which hit on the right wrist of his nephew. He gave another blow of kappa to his nephew, which hit on his right arm. Batti gave a blow of kappa to his nephew, which hit on his right wrist. Jugraj Singh and Hardev Singh caught hold of his nephew from his hair and pulled and also gave fist blows. When he tried to rescue his nephew, the accused persons also pushed him. They raised noise, on which all the accused persons fled from the spot along with their respective weapons on their motorcycles. The applicant-accused is specifically named in the FIR. Specific role has been attributed to him. The weapons used for the commission of the crime are yet to be recovered. The allegations against the applicant-accused are serious in nature. So, for thorough investigation of this case, the custodial interrogation of the applicant-accused shall be required. As such, a prayer has been made to dismiss the anticipatory bail application filed by the applicant-accused.

6. From the perusal of the file, it transpires that the present case FIR has been registered against the applicant-accused and others on the aforesaid allegations. The grievous injury on the person of injured Sartaj Singh under Section 117(2) of the BNS has been attributed to the applicant-accused, which is bailable in nature. Keeping in view all the facts and circumstances of the case, at this stage, without commenting anything on the merits of the case, the applicant-accused is directed to join the investigation on or before the date fixed and in the event of his

arrest, he shall be admitted to interim anticipatory bail by the Arresting Officer/ Investigating Officer/ SHO concerned.
