AMJ, SSH, SST, ABK Advocate present. Plaintiff, D-1, 2 and 4 are present. D-3 is minor and represented by minor guardian mother D-2. D-5 is minor and represented by minor guardian mother D-4.

Shri SSH Advocate filed application U/o 32 Rule 7 of CPC seeking permission to D-2 to compromise the matter on behalf of her minor daughter D-3 stating that the compromise is for the benefit of minor. SSH Advocate has also filed certificate stating that the compromise is for the benefit of Minor D-3. Shri SST Advocate filed application U/o 32 Rule 7 of CPC seeking permission to D-4 to compromise the matter on behalf of her minor son D-5 stating that the compromise is for the benefit of minor. SST Advocate has also filed certificate stating that the compromise is for the benefit of Minor D-5. Perused. Heard and the applications are allowed in the interest of justice. D-2 and 4 are permitted to compromise the matter on behalf of minor D-3 and 5 for their benefit and interest.

Both filed Joint compromise petition. Contents of the Joint compromise petition are read over and explained to the parties in the language known to them. All of them admitted the contents of the Joint compromise

petition and submitted they have voluntarily compromised the matter. All of them signed to the order sheet in the open court by admitting the joint compromise petition. On perusal of the Joint compromise petition, it is clear that it is uninfluenced and with free consent. Parties admit the contents of the compromise as legal and valid. Hence, this Court proceed to pass the following :-

ORDER

The Joint compromise petition is hereby allowed.

The Joint compromise petition is treated as part and parcel of the decree.

Office is hereby directed to keep the compromise petition along with the decree as a permanent record.

Draw Decree accordingly.

Office is directed to refund the Court fee to the party as per law.
