Anticipatory Bail application under Section 482 BNSS.

ORDER:

1. Applicants/accused have filed the present application under Section 482 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 (BNSS) for grant of anticipatory bail.

2. Report of Ahlmad received that no bail application qua the same applicants is pending or decided by any Court.

3. Notice of bail application was given to I.O./SHO and ASI Hargobind Singh, No. 876/SAS Nagar, now posted at Police Station Handesra, Mohali appeared and recorded his statement to the effect that this is the first anticipatory bail application filed by the applicants/accused. Offence under Section 109 of BNS has been added in the present case vide DDR No. 15 dated 11.05.2026. No other FIR is found to be registered against applicants/accused. Applicant Sonia is also injured in the same incident but she has not handed over medical record till date. Custodial interrogation of applicants/accused is required for proper investigation.

4. The brief facts are that the present FIR was registered on the statement of Major Singh that on 28.02.2026 at around 08:00 PM, his son Manjot Singh aged about 10 years was being beaten up by sons of his neighbourer Laddi. He got them separated and took Manjot to his house. After some time, Laddi, Manga, Sonia, Melo, Manjit and Toori came infront of his gate and started abusing him. When he alongwith his family went outside, then Swaran Singh alongwith his son Laddi took father of complainant Amarjit Singh near their shop where Swaran Singh caught hold of the arms of his father and Laddi kicked him on his private part. Manga gave fist blows to him. Sonia, Melo, Malkiat, Toori pushed their gate and abused them. When he tried to rescue his father, above said assailants also roughed him up and also threatened to kill him. His father has suffered

internal injuries on his private part. On the above statement, FIR was registered.

5. Counsel for the applicants/accused has argued that there is no direct attribution to the applicants/accused. No offence under Section 109 of BNS is made out as no weapon was used to inflict the injuries to injured Amarjit Singh. Nothing is to be recovered from the applicants/accused. Even applicant no.1 was also beaten up by complainant and his family. So he prayed that bail application be allowed.

6. On the other hand, ld. Addl. PP for the State has argued that allegations against the applicants/accused are serious in nature as the injury suffered by Amarjit father of complainant was declared dangerous to life by the doctors. So he prayed that bail application be dismissed.

7. Rival contentions heard and record perused.

8. There is no specific attribution against the applicants/accused. Main allegations are against Swaran Singh, Laddi and Manga who have allegedly beaten up father of complainant. Allegations against the applicants/accused are only that they have abused the complainant and his family. Nothing is to be recovered from the applicants/accused. Even applicant no.1 was also injured in the alleged scuffle.

9. Hence, keeping in view the above said facts and circumstances and without commenting upon the merits of the case, this Court is of the opinion that custodial interrogation of the applicants/accused is not required.

10. Thus applicants/accused are granted interim anticipatory bail and they are directed to join investigation within 7 days and on their doing so, they shall be admitted to bail to the satisfaction of Arresting Officer/investigating

officer. Applicants/accused shall cooperate in the investigation and shall appear as and when called by the investigating officer. They shall comply with the following conditions:-

1. That the applicant(s) shall join the investigation as and when called by the investigating agency;
2. That the applicant(s) shall not tamper with the prosecution evidence;
3. That the applicant(s) shall not leave the country without prior permission of the court;
4. That the applicant(s) shall abide by the terms and conditions as envisaged under Section 482 (2) of BNSS.

For report of the investigating officer, adjourned to 11.06.2026.
