ORDERS

The present Petition is filed by the Petitioner who is the accused No.2 in this case under Section 439 of Cr.P.C., for bail on the ground that the Respondent Police have registered case in

Cr.No.83/2020 against the accused for the offences punishable under Section 307, 109, 120(B) r/w Section 34 of IPC.

2. The case of the Prosecution is that, the Respondent Police registered case based on the complaint given by one Karthik alleging that on 4.5.2020 there was a quarrel between the Complainant and Accused. It was also alleged that on 5.5.2020 at about 9.15 p.m., the accused along with other accused persons tried to attack the Complainant near B.B.Bakery, CMH Road, the Complainant ran away from the place and rescued himself from the accused. When he was near Murphy Town at about 10.00 p.m., the accused persons came on two two wheelers and surrounded the Complainant and threatened the Complainant that he will take away his life and took out machete and long and attacked the Complainant on his head and other parts of the body with an intention to kill him.

3. The Petitioner has contended that he is innocent of the offences alleged against him. The entire material placed before the Court are not sufficient to hold that this Petitioner has committed any offence as alleged by the prosecution. There is no enmity between the Petitioner and the Complainant. The

Petitioner has no motive to kill or attempt to kill the Complainant. The Petitioner has got valid and tenable defence. The Petitioner is ready to furnish surety to the satisfaction of the Court to release him on bail. He is ready and willing to undertake to abide any conditions imposed by this Court. The Petitioner is the permanent resident of Bangalore City. After completing investigation, the Respondent Police have already filed charge sheet in this case. The Petitioner has got deep roots in the society and he is law abiding and peace loving citizen and hailing from respectable family. The Complainant was not having grievous injury and he already discharged from the hospital long back. If the Petitioner is enlarged on bail, he will regularly attend the Court. The Petitioner may not tamper the prosecution witnesses and he will not flee from justice. Hence, prayed to allow the petition.

4. For the said application the PP has filed objections reiterating the contents of the complaint and further contended that the offences alleged against the Petitioner are grievous in nature and punishable with life imprisonment. If the Petition is allowed, there is every chance of tampering the prosecution

witnesses. The Petitioner No.1/accused No.2 is involved in one more case registered in Mico Layout Police Station. If the Petition is allowed, there is every chance of their abscondance. The Petitioner has filed Crl.Misc.No.25403/2020 for the same relief and the said petition was dismissed by this Court on 3.8.2020. Hence, prayed to dismiss the petition. Along with the objection PP has filed CD in this case.

5. On the basis of the above, the point that arises for my consideration are:-

- 1) Whether the Petition deserves to be allowed?
- 2) What order?

6. My answer to the above points are :

Point No.1 : In the Negative.

Point No.2 : As per the final order for the following:-

REASONS

7. The offences alleged against the Petitioner are under Section 307, 109 120(B) r/w Section 34 of IPC. Admittedly, Petitioner who is accused No.2 has filed Crl.Misc.No.25403/2020.

The said petition was dismissed by this Court by order dtd:3.8.2020. In the present petition, the Petitioner has not at all stated about the earlier petitions. He has not pleaded any changed circumstances in the present case. As already held by this Court, the Petitioner/accused appears to be habitual offenders. The Petitioner is involved in similar case of Mico Layout Police Station. From this it is clear that the Petitioner has not approached the Court with clean hands. The present case is registered against the Petitioner on the basis of the complaint dtd: 6.5.2020 and admittedly on 4.5.2020, accused Mani had filed complaint against the present Complainant and other accused. Considering the facts and circumstances of the present case, if the Petitioner is released on bail, there is every chance of involving in similar offences and also there is chance of his abscondance. In the present case, still accused No.4 and 6 are absconding. In the present case, the IO has filed charge sheet after completing investigation. Since, already this Court has dismissed the bail petition of this Petitioner/accused No.2 and as there is no changed circumstances to consider the bail petition of Petitioner afresh, this Court is of the view that the Petitioner is not entitled for bail. Under these circumstances, this Court is

of the view that the accused is not entitled for bail at this stage.
Hence, I answer Point No.1 in the Negative.

8. **Point No.2**:- In the result, this Court proceeds to pass the following:-

ORDER

The Petition filed by the Petitioner/accused No.2 Dinesh under Sec.439 Cr.P.C., is hereby dismissed.
