

Criminal Misc. Case – 284 of 2026

Order No. 04 dated 18.03.2026

The application u/s 482 of B.N.S.S. filed by the accused-petitioner, namely, Biplab Das, praying for anticipatory bail in connection with N.J.P. P.S. Case No.586/2025 dated 23.08.2025 u/s-316(2)318(4)/351(2)/79/3(5) of B.N.S., is taken up for hearing.

Ld. Lawyer for the accused-petitioner submitted that no bail petition has ever been filed in connection with this case before any higher Court on any earlier occasion and an affidavit has also been filed on behalf of the accused-petitioner in support of such contention by the Ld. Defence Lawyer and the Ld. P.P, Jalpaiguri conceded to the fact as submitted by the Ld. Defence lawyer.

It is the case of the accused-petitioner that the present accused-petitioner has been falsely implicated in this case out of grudge and vendetta. It has also been contended that the other co-accused person is on bail. It has been contended further that investigation has been progressed a lot. Considering the above facts and circumstances, it is prayed that this accused-petitioner may be granted with anticipatory bail.

Ld. Public Prosecutor, Jalpaiguri, opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail.

Heard the Ld. Lawyer for the accused-petitioner and the Ld. Public Prosecutor, Jalpaiguri.

Perused the application under Sec.482 of B.N.S.S., T.C.R and the case diary. Considered.

Fact of the case in short is that the defacto complainant entrusted the present petitioner and another accused, Dipankar Mondal to look after his medicine business but taking this advantage, the petitioner and his co-associate syphoned the money of the business. During investigation, accused Dipankar Mondal was arrested and as C.S could not be submitted within statutory period, he was granted statutory bail. The present accused-petitioner Biplab Das has come up with the application under sec.482 of BNSS.

Considering the nature and gravity of the offence and considering the materials on record and C.D., I am of the view that investigation is in progress and at this stage, I do not find any reason to grant bail to the petitioner.

Hence, it is

ORDERED

that the instant anticipatory bail application filed by the accused-petitioner Biplab Das u/s 482 of B.N.S.S. stands rejected.

Send a copy of this order along with T.C.R. to the Ld. C.J.M., Jalpaiguri, for information and taking necessary action.

Return C.D.

Thus, the Criminal Misc. case is disposed of.
