The application for u/s 482 of B.N.S.S. filed by the accused-petitioners, namely, 1.1. Amulya Barman, 2. Smt. Lalo Barman and 3. Smt. Chumki Barman @ Singha, praying for anticipatory bail in connection with Bhaktinagar P.S. Case No.226/2026 dated 14.03.2026, u/s-85/109 of B.N.S., R/W sec.3/ 4 of D.P. Act, corresponding to P.T.N. No.WBJP02P001732/2026, is taken up for hearing.

Learned Advocate for the accused-petitioners submits that no bail application filed by the accused-petitioners is either rejected or pending by or before any upper forum including Hon'ble High Court, Calcutta in connection with the instant case.

The bail application filed before this Court by the accused-petitioners also reflect the same and the Ld. Public Prosecutor, Jalpaiguri concedes to such facts.

Ld. Advocate for the accused-petitioners submitted that the present accused-petitioners are the in-laws members of the victim/ wife and they are residing in separate mess. The accused-petitioners have been falsely implicated in this case out of personal grudge and vendetta. On all such grounds, it is submitted that anticipatory bail should be granted to the accused-petitioners.

On the other hand, Ld. Public Prosecutor, Jalpaiguri raised objection.

Heard both sides.

Perused the materials on record and C.D.

On perusal of the materials available before this Court, it appears that investigation in this case has progressed to a considerable extent and statements of vital witnesses have been recorded. Nature of injury as reflected in the injury report is simple. There is no incriminating materials in the C.D. to attract sec.109 of B.N.S. Present petitioners are the in-laws members of the victim/wife.

Considering all the above facts and circumstances, I do not find that custodial interrogation or detention of the present accused-petitioners is required in this case and accordingly, the prayer for anticipatory bail for the present accused-petitioners is allowed.

Hence, in the event of arrest, the accused-petitioners, namely, 1. Amulya Barman, 2. Smt. Lalo Barman and 3. Smt. Chumki Barman @ Singha be released on furnishing bond of Rs.2,000/- each with one (1) surety of like amount each, subject to satisfaction of the arresting officer and due compliance with usual provisions as laid down under Sec.482(2) of B.N.S.S.

Let a copy of this order along with T.C.R be sent to the learned C.J.M, Jalpaiguri, for information and taking necessary action.

Return C.D.

Thus, the Criminal Misc. case is disposed of.
