



ORDER BELOW EXH. 1 IN CIVIL M.A.No. 143/2026
(Decided on this 05rd Day of August, 2026)

This is an application under Section 2 of the Bombay Regulation VIII of 1827, for grant of heir-ship certificate.

02. Applicant is mother of deceased namely Prashant Kishtu Sakpelliwar. Deceased Prashant Kishtu Sakpelliwar died unmarried on 24/03/2026 at Sathe Nagar, Kinwat Tq. Kinwat Dist. Nanded, leaving behind the applicant. It is contention of applicant that, she is sole legal heir of deceased Prashant Kishtu Sakpelliwar. After the death of Prashant Kishtu Sakpelliwar applicant wants heir-ship certificate for getting formally recognized as a heir of deceased. For that purpose she has filed this application for heir-ship certificate.

03. The public citation was executed on 02/07/2026 and paper publication was circulated in daily Newspaper "Dainik Mahasagar" on 19/06/2026 calling upon the objections from the public at large. Nobody appeared and objected the claim of the applicant.

04. I have heard the learned advocate for the applicant at length.

05. Considering the pleading of the applicant and the material placed on record, following points arise for my determination and I have recorded my findings thereon with reasons as under.

:- REASONS :-

AS TO POINT NOS.1 AND 2 :-

06. In support of the application, applicant examined herself by filing her affidavit vide Exhibit No.09 reiterating the contents of the application, which requires no further repetition.

07. The applicant has also produced death certificate of deceased Prashant Kishtu Sakpelliwar at Exhibit No.13, heirs certificate given by C.E.O., Municipal Council, Kinwat Tq. Kinwat Dist. Nanded at Exhibit No.14 and verified copy of her Aadhar card at Exhibit No.15. On perusal of the said documents, it is seen that Prashant Kishtu Sakpelliwar died on 24/03/2026. In present matter nobody came forward within one month and objected the claim of applicant for the grant of heir-ship certificate. Thus, evidence of applicant remained unchallenged.

08. The applicant is mother of deceased namely Prashant Kishtu Sakpelliwar, she is only legal heir of the deceased, and entitled to get the heir-ship certificate. Hence, I do not find any impediment in granting heir-ship certificate in the name of applicant for formally recognizing her as a sole heir of deceased Prashant Kishtu Sakpelliwar.

09. Needless to mention that, the certificate confers, no right to the property but only indicates the person who for the time being, is in a legal management thereof. Granting of certificate under this order does not finally determine, nor injure the rights of any person. Hence, point No.1 is answered in the affirmative and in answer to point No.2, I proceed to pass the following order:-

:-ORDER:-

1]	Application is allowed.
2]	Issue heir-ship certificate in the name of the applicant for formally recognizing her as a sole legal heir of deceased Prashant Kishtu Sakpelliwar on payment of requisite court fee, as per law.
3]	The applicant to comply the provisions of para 312 of the Civil Manual.
