ORDER:

Status report produced, which is taken on the file. Police
record also produced.

2. Applicant-accused has filed the present bail application under
Sections 483 BNSS, 2023 for releasing him on bail for offence under
Section 21/61/85 of NDPS Act.

3. It is submitted that the applicant-accused is already in

custody since 20.6.2026 and has been falsely implicated in the present case. He is totally innocent. The alleged recovery has already been effected and now nothing is to be recovered from him. The presentation of challan and the conclusion of trial of the case is likely to take considerable time. Report of FSL has not been received, so prayer has been made to admit the applicant-accused on bail.

4. Notice of the bail application was given to the State. Learned Addl.P.P for the State has argued that present-accused was found in possession of 10 grams heroin without any licence or permit. Report of FSL has not been received and there are serious allegations against him. He is also involved in two other criminal cases under the NDPS Act, so prayer has been made to dismiss the present bail application.

5. Heard. Record perused. Perusal of record, it transpires that on 20.06.2026 police party headed by ASI Lakhvir Singh apprehended the applicant-accused and 10 grams heroin without any licence or permit has been recovered from him. The presentation of challan and conclusion of trial is likely to take considerable time. The report of FSL has also not been received. The allegations against the accused are still to be established during trial of the present case. The alleged recovery of contraband falls within the ambit of “ non commercial quantity”. No useful purpose would be served by keeping applicant-accused behind bars. With regard to pendency of other criminal cases as mentioned in the status report, no record qua those cases has been placed on record. Accordingly, the present bail application stands allowed and applicant-

accused is admitted to bail on furnishing bail bonds in the sum of Rs.30,000/- with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of learned trial Court/Illaqa Magistrate/Senior Duty Magistrate,Ludhiana subject to the conditions that ;-

- (i) he shall appear in the Court on each and every date of hearing;
- (ii) he shall not commit an offence similar to the offence of which he is accused, or suspected, of the commission of which he is suspected, and
- (iii) he shall not directly or indirectly make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade him from disclosing such facts to the Court or to any police office or tamper with the evidence.
- (iv) he shall not give any threat or intimidation to the prosecution witnesses;
- (v) he shall not indulge in any criminal activity;
- (vi) he shall not leave India without prior permission of the Court;

Recently, Hon'ble Supreme Court has issued guidelines for compliance of bail orders in **Suo Motu Writ Petition (Criminal) No.4/2021 dated 31.01.2023**. The Hon'ble Supreme Court has also passed directions to adopt the procedure termed as 'FASTER' for Fast and Secured Transmission of Electronic Records, in order to reduce the delay caused in forwarding the orders granting bail to the Jail Authorities. Accordingly, copy of this bail order be immediately forwarded to the **Superintendent Central Jail, Ludhiana** for strict compliance through e-mail. Criminal Ahlmad is directed to make necessary compliance.

Police record be returned. Copy of this order be sent to the court concerned. File of the instant bail application be attached with the remand papers pending in the court.
