ORDER:

Applicant-accused has filed the present application for surrender and bail for releasing him on bail for offence under Section 379-B, 34 of IPC.

2. Learned counsel for the applicant-accused has argued that applicant-accused was regularly appearing in the present case but on some dates, he could not appear as his previous counsel asked him not to appear before the Court on each and every date of hearing by giving assurance that he himself appear on his behalf and due to this he stopped appearing and his non bailable warrant of arrest was issued. The challan has been

presented but the conclusion of trial of the case is likely to take considerable time. His absence from the trial Court was neither wilful nor intentional rather due to aforesaid reasons. In the last prayer has been made to admit the applicant-accused on bail.

3. Notice of the bail application was given to the State. Learned Addl.P.P for the State has argued that applicant-accused has already abused and misused the concession of bail and he does not deserve to be released on bail. In the last prayer has been made to dismiss the present bail application.

4. I have considered the submissions made by learned counsel for applicant-accused, learned Addl. PP for the State and have gone through the record carefully.

5. Perusal of record, it transpires that on 10.4.2026 applicant-accused remained absent from the proceedings before this Court and accordingly in order to procure his presence, his non bailable warrant of arrest were issued. Subsequently his bail order and bail bonds were cancelled. On 20.7.2026, he surrendered before this Court and filed application for bail. The prosecution evidence stands concluded and the case is presently fixed for recording the statement of the accused under Section 313 Cr.P.C.

6. Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the case, the stage of the trial, the voluntary surrender of the applicant-accused before this Court and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this Court is of the considered opinion that the applicant-accused deserves to be admitted to bail. Accordingly, the present application is allowed. The applicant-accused Sandeep Kumar @ Sheepa is ordered to be released on

regular bail subject to his furnishing fresh bail bonds in the sum of Rs.30,000/- with one surety in the like amount subject to the further condition that;-

- (i) he shall appear in the Court on each and every date of hearing;
- (ii) he shall not commit an offence similar to the offence of which he is accused, or suspected, of the commission of which he is suspected, and
- (iii) he shall not directly or indirectly make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade him from disclosing such facts to the Court or to any police office or tamper with the evidence.
- (iv) he shall not give any threat or intimidation to the prosecution witnesses;
- (v) he shall not indulge in any criminal activity;
- (vi) he shall not leave India without prior permission of the Court;

Recently, Hon'ble Supreme Court has issued guidelines for compliance of bail orders in Suo Motu Writ Petition (Criminal) No.4/2021 dated 31.01.2023. The Hon'ble Supreme Court has also passed directions to adopt the procedure termed as 'FASTER' for Fast and Secured Transmission of Electronic Records, in order to reduce the delay caused in forwarding the orders granting bail to the Jail Authorities. Accordingly, copy of this bail order be immediately forwarded to the Superintendent Central Jail, Ludhiana for strict compliance through e-mail. Criminal Ahlmad is directed to make necessary compliance.
