The case record is taken up for reconciliation.

Both the parties file haziras.

Learned Advocate for both the parties are also present.

Parties filed the instant suit u/s 13B of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 praying for divorce on mutual consent.

The record is taken up for hearing.

Both the parties are appeared by filing their respective affidavit-in-chief and examined as PW-1 & PW-2. Their copy of Aadhaar Cards are marked as Ext.1 and Ext.2.

Petitioners filed the instant suit u/s 13B of Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 stating inter-alia that their marriage was solemnized on **15.12.2010**, according to Hindu rites and customs. Out of the wedlock, they have got one son who is now 13 years old and it is decided that petitioner No.2 will take the custody of the said minor son and also maintain him. It is their contention that since after the marriage, they found a lot of different regarding their social status, living standard, taste, habits and culture etc, in between them which caused their mental agony. The parties reported the matter to their respective relatives and and well-wishers to settled the dispute but there was no fruitful result and it was not possible for them to carry out their marital life and accordingly, they started to live separately on and from **01.06.2024**. Since then all their affords to reconcile the matter went in vain and then they have mutually decided to go for mutual divorce.

Both the parties supported their version in the petition u/s 13B of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955. They both stated in their respective evidence and they have mutually agreed to dissolve their marriage and there is no collusion in filing the petition for mutual divorce.

Having heard the submission of both sides as well as considering the evidence and facts and circumstances of the case, I am of the view that marriage between the parties should be dissolved by a decree of divorce on mutual consent.



The Court Fee paid is correct.

Hence it is,

O R D E R E D

That the **Matrimonial Suit No. 293 of 2025** be and the same is decreed on mutual consent without any cost.

The marriage between **Smt. Shashi Das (Mandal)** and **Sri Pintu Mandal** solemnized on **15.12.2010** is dissolved by a decree of divorce on mutual consent u/s 13B of the Hindu Marriage Act,1955 from this day.
