

STATE OF HARYANA Vs AJITAS

Present: Ld. APP for State.

1) The present application has been moved on behalf of the applicant/accused Amit seeking grant of regular bail.

2) Notice of the application was issued. The State has filed its reply opposing the bail application. Learned counsel for the applicant as well as learned Public Prosecutor for the State have been heard. The case file has also been carefully perused.

3)The allegations against the applicant pertain to commission of offences involving cyber fraud/economic crime. The prosecution alleges that the applicant was actively involved in the commission of the alleged offence, whereby innocent persons were dishonestly induced and wrongful gain was obtained through digital and electronic means. The investigation reveals prima facie material connecting the applicant with the alleged offence.

4) It is well settled that while considering an application for bail, the Court is required to take into consideration, inter alia, the nature and gravity of the accusation, the severity of punishment in the event of conviction, the role

attributed to the accused, the likelihood of the accused influencing witnesses or tampering with evidence, and the larger interest of society.

- 5) Cyber fraud has emerged as one of the fastest-growing forms of organized crime, causing substantial financial loss to victims and seriously undermining public confidence in digital transactions. Such offences are generally executed through sophisticated means, involve electronic evidence, multiple persons, and complex financial transactions. Economic offences and cyber crimes stand on a different footing, as they have deep-rooted conspiracies and serious repercussions on society at large. Therefore, such offences deserve a cautious and strict approach while considering the grant of bail.
- 6) Considering the nature of allegations, the gravity and seriousness of the offence, the manner in which the alleged offence has been committed, and the larger societal impact of cyber fraud, this Court is of the considered opinion that no ground for grant of bail is made out at this stage. Grant of bail in such circumstances may adversely affect the fair

course of investigation/trial and would not be in the interest of justice.

7)Accordingly, without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, the present bail application filed by the applicant/accused s hereby **dismissed and disposed of**.
