File taken up today as 14.04.2026 was declared a holiday on account of Ambedkar Jayanti.

Present : Sh. Rajnish Kumar Banyal, Ld. Counsel for Decree Holder through VC.

Nazir's report is received.

JD is reported to be the resident of Shahdara District.

Ld. Counsel for the DH submitted that there are no attachable effects to be found within the jurisdiction of this Court and seeks transfer of the decree for execution to the appropriate Court having jurisdiction in the Shahdara District and issuance of Transfer Certificate in this regard.

Heard. File perused.

The present execution petition is for enforcement of Judgment and decree dated 24.7.2025 passed by the Ld. Predecessor of this Court in case titled as "Bank of Baroda Vs. Imran, bearing CS (Comm) No.129/2025.

As per Nazir's report, the DH has moved this execution petition for claim of decree for a sum of Rs.11,46,396/- alongwith interest @ 9.15% per annum and cost of Rs.13,745/-.

Neither does the JD reside or work for gain within the territorial limits of this Court nor does the JD have any attachable effects / immovable property situated within

jurisdiction of this Court. The request of Ld. Counsel for DH for issuance of Transfer Certificate is therefore allowed invoking provisions under Section 39 read with Section 151 and Order 21 Rule 6 CPC, and the decree is being sent to the Court of Ld. Principal District & Sessions Judge, Shahdara District, Karkardooma Courts, Delhi for execution and satisfaction as no part of the decree is capable of being satisfied by any process of this Court. Transfer Certificate be issued as per rules.

File be consigned to be revived on the receipt of report from the Court to which the decree is sent for execution / satisfaction.
