The application for bail U/s.482 BNSS filed by the petitioners as named above is taken up for hearing.

Heard the Ld. lawyer for the accused petitioners and the Ld. P.P. Murshidabad.

Ld. Advocate for the accused petitioners prays for anticipatory bail on the ground that the petitioners have falsely been implicated in this case and they may be granted anticipatory bail.

It is also submitted by the Ld. Advocate for the petitioners that no such application for bail on the selfsame cause of action has been filed before or rejected by Hon'ble Court, to which, the Ld. P.P. expressed his agreement.

Ld. P.P. Murshidabad has raised objection to the prayer for bail.

Perused the FIR and other materials in the C.D.

I have carefully gone through the statement of the witnesses including that of the injured victims, recorded U/s.180 of BNSS together with the injury reports available at page nos. 23 & 24 in the C.D. discloses that the injuries, sustained by the alleged injured persons is simple in nature.

Considering the nature of allegation made and the materials in C.D. including the nature of injuries, I am the view that there is no need of custodial interrogation of the present accused petitioners for the purpose of investigation. Accordingly, the prayer for anticipatory bail stands **allowed**.

Accordingly, in the event of arrest of the petitioners as named above in c/w the above noted P.S. case, they shall be released on furnishing bail bond of **Rs.5,000/- each** with two sureties of **Rs.2,500/- each**, subject to the satisfaction of the arresting officer.

If released on bail, the petitioners are directed to comply with the conditions mentioned in Section 482(2) of BNSS.

The Crl. Misc. Case is thus disposed of.
