The application for anticipatory bail U/s.482 of BNSS, filed by the petitioner as named above is taken up for hearing this day.

Heard the Ld. Advocate for the petitioner and the Ld. P.P.

Ld. Advocate for the present petitioner submits that the marriage between the complainant and the petitioner took place 13 years ago. He submits that the allegations made are false. He prays for granting anticipatory bail to the accused petitioner.

It is also submitted by the Ld. Advocate for the petitioner that no such application for bail on the selfsame cause of action has ever been filed before or rejected by the Hon'ble High Court, Calcutta, to which, the Ld. P.P. expressed his agreement.

Ld. P.P submits that there are allegations of dowry demand and assault.

Perused the TCR and the Case Diary.

The victim did not undergo any medical treatment.

Considering the nature of allegation and the material appearing on record, there appears no necessity for custodial interrogation.

Accordingly, the prayer for anticipatory bail is **allowed**.

Accordingly, in the event of arrest of the petitioner as named above in c/w the above noted P.S. case, he shall be released on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 2000/- with one surety of like amount, subject to the satisfaction of the arresting officer.

If released on bail, the petitioner is directed to comply with the conditions mentioned in Section 482(2) of BNSS.

The Crl. Misc. Case is thus disposed of.
