The application for anticipatory bail U/s.482 of BNSS, filed by the petitioner as named above is taken up for hearing.

Heard the Ld. lawyer for the accused petitioner and the Ld. P.P., Murshidabad.

Ld. Advocate for the present petitioner submits that the accused petitioner is the husband of the complainant. He also submits that the allegations leveled against the accused petitioner are false.

It is also submitted by the Ld. Advocate for the petitioner that no such application for bail on the selfsame cause of action has ever been filed before or rejected by the Hon'ble High Court, Calcutta, to which, the Ld. P.P. expressed his agreement.

Ld. P.P., Murshidabad submits that statement of the witnesses have been recorded and the injury report has been collected.

Perused the T.C.R. and the Case Diary.

Having considered the nature of allegation made and the materials appearing on record including the Injury report, I find no necessity of custodial interrogation of the present petitioner for the purpose of investigation.

Accordingly, the prayer for anticipatory bail stands **allowed**.

Accordingly, in the event of arrest of the petitioner as named above in c/w the above noted P.S. case, he shall be released on furnishing bail bond of Rs.2,500/- with one surety of like amount, subject to the satisfaction of the arresting officer.

If released on bail, the petitioner is directed to comply with the conditions mentioned in Section 482(2) of BNSS.

Return the T.C.R. and the C.D.

The Crl. Misc. Case is thus disposed of.
