The application for bail U/s.483 BNSS filed by the petitioner as named above is taken up for hearing.

Ld. Defence Advocate has submitted that the present accused petitioner has been falsely implicated in this case and he is in custody since 20.05.2026 and considering the same, he may be granted bail.

It is also submitted by the Ld. Advocate for the petitioner that no such application for bail on the selfsame cause of action has ever been filed before or rejected by the Hon'ble High Court, Calcutta or by this Court, to which, the Ld. P.P. expressed his agreement.

Ld. P.P.-in-Charge, Murshidabad Md. Arifuzzaman has submitted that the statement of the alleged victim lady has not yet been collected.

Perused the FIR and the materials gathered in the C.D.

From the tone of the F.I.R. it is appearing that during living matrimonial relationship with her husband, the defacto complainant developed intimacy with the accused person and, as per instigation of the accused, she dissolved her marital tie with her husband, but, subsequently, the accused refused to marry her despite co-habiting with her on different occasions on promise of marriage.

The envelope, containing the statement of the alleged victim lady U/s.183 of BNSS is opened in open Court, seen the said statement and after keeping the same in the envelope, the envelope is re-sealed.

The victim lady has declined Medico Legal Examination.

Considered the said statement of the victim lady U/s.183 of BNSS.

Considering the overall facts and circumstances gathered and the period of detention of the accused in custody since 20.05.2026, it appears to me that further custodial detention of the present accused petitioner will not serve any substantial purpose for the investigation.

Accordingly, the prayer for bail of the present accused petitioner stands allowed.

Accordingly, the accused petitioner, in c/w the above noted P.S. case, shall be released on furnishing bail bond of Rs.10,000/- with two sureties of Rs.5,000/- each, subject to the satisfaction of the Ld. Chief Judicial Magistrate, Murshidabad.

The Crl. Misc. Case is thus disposed of.
