First Bail application under Section 439 CrPC.

ORDER:-

- 1) This application under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure for grant of regular bail was filed by bail applicant-accused Paramjit Kaur on 17.06.2025 in case F.I.R. aforementioned.
- 2) Notice of the bail application was issued to the respondent State and learned Additional Public Prosecutor for the State has contested the bail application. Police record has been requisitioned and received.

3) The learned counsel for the applicant-accused has submitted that the applicant-accused is innocent, has not committed any offence. The applicant-accused is in custody since 25.05.2025. The trial of the case will take a long time and no useful purpose will be served by keeping the accused-applicant in custody.

4) Record perused. The allegations of the prosecution are that 06 grams of Heroin was allegedly recovered from the applicant when the police party headed by ASI Paramjit Singh was on patrolling in the search of bad elements apprehended her in the area of Old Bridge, Dhilwan, Kapurthala. CFSL report has not yet been received in this case.

5) As per the case of the prosecution, the recovery of 06 grams of Heroin has allegedly recovered from the the applicant falls in non-commercial quantity. The applicant/accused is already in custody from 25.05.2025. Her further custody is not required for any purpose. The challan is not likely to be presented soon. Moreover, the trial will take sufficient long time. Till then the applicant-accused cannot be kept behind the bars. Resultantly, the present bail application is allowed and the applicant/accused is ordered to be released on bail on her furnishing bail bonds in the sum of Rs.50,000/- with one surety in the like amount/cash surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of learned Area/Duty Magistrate Court, subject to the following conditions:-

1. That the applicant/accused shall appear in the Court on each and every date of hearing;

2. That the applicant/accused shall not leave India without prior permission of the court and shall not induce the prosecution witnesses;
3. That the applicant/accused shall not tamper with the prosecution evidence.

6) Copy of this order be sent to the learned Illaqa/ Duty Magistrate forthwith under the signatures of Reader for compliance. The court concerned is directed to send the bail bonds to this Court after acceptance of the same. A soft copy of bail order be sent by E-Mail to the applicant/accused through Superintendent Jail. Bail application be tagged with the remand papers/file.
