

The petitioner counsel has filed IA Under Order 32 R 7 of CPC and seeking permission to compromise the case in the interest of minor petitioner No.3 and 4 and filed affidavit of the guardian of the petitioner No.3 and 4 and Pleader's Certificate. After considering the reasons stated in the affidavit it appears that the said compromise in the interest and welfare of minor, therefore IA is allowed. Minor guardian of petitioner No.3 and 4 are permitted to compromise the case on behalf of the minor petitioners and certificate of advocate is accepted.

BEFORE NATIONAL LOK ADALATH ON 08.07.2023

Petitioner and Respondent No.1 compromised the matter. Both parties have filed a joint memo and prays for pass the award. The terms and conditions are read out and explained to the parties. They voluntarily agreed to the terms and conditions. The compromise is not opposed to any law for time being in force. The insurance company has agreed to deposit Rs.28,00,000/- with nil interest. Hence, I proceed to pass the following:

ORDER

Joint memo filed by the parties is accepted. The claim amount is settled for Rs.28,00,000/-. Accordingly the respondent No.1 is hereby directed to deposit the amount of Rs.28,00,000/- in the court as agreed in the joint memo.

After depositing, entire compensation amount of Rs.4,00,000/- each shall be released in favour of petitioner No.1 and 2 with proper verification and identification and Rs.10,00,000/- each shall be deposit in the name of the petitioner No.3 and 4 in any nationalized bank as per the choice of guardian of petitioner till attains age of majority.

The joint memo is part and parcel of the compromise award.

Draw the award accordingly.
