JUDGEMENT

Factual Matrix of the case

1. It is the case of the prosecution that on 10/02/2022 at about 17:45 hours, SI Tapas Saha received a source information that the narcotic racketeers brought a consignment of contraband phensedyl stored at the house of one Golam



Ahmed Mirza S/O -Selim Mia, resident of Vill- Mahabbatpur , Jamshedtola, PS- Kaliachak, Dist- Malda. Accordingly, SI Tapas Saha informed the matter to Sri Prashanta Debnath, Dy. SP.(HQ) Malda and requested him to send an authorization certificate U/S 41(2)NDPS Act,1985 for holding search and seizure. After obtaining authorization U/S 41(2) of NDPS Act, SI Tapas Saha and other force went to the house of Golam Ahmed Mirza, vide GDE No. 368, dated 10/02/2022. At 19:05 hrs, SI Tapas Saha and other force arrived at Mahabbatpur, Jamshedtola, under P.S. Kaliachak, as per the source identification the police force entered into the house of the alleged accused person and found that the house was a single storey brick built. Meanwhile, getting the sent of police, a large number of people including women gathered there and commotion began and police warned. Thereafter, SI Tapas Saha searched for local witnesses at and around the PO to be present during search process but none came forward. Then the police personnel entered into the said house and started to search the house thoroughly, none was present in the house at that time, every one fled away from the house hearing the news of the arrival of the police. During search the Police personnel recovered one nylon sack tied with rope containing 300 bottles of Phensedyle Cough Linctus and another nylon sack tied with rope containing 100 bottles of Phensedyle Cough Linctus, total 400 Bottles from the third room situated on the right side to enter into the house of the alleged accused person. Thereafter the recovered phensedyle Bottles were seized under proper seizure list in presence of available witnesses and labeled in presence of police witnesses. The process of seizure and label were done from 20:20 hrs to 21:45 hrs of 10/02/2022. Over the said incident the written complaint was lodged by SI Tapas Saha of Golapganj I.C before the I/C Kaliachak PS.

2. The complaint has been registered as Kaliachak PS Case No.164/2022 dated 10.02.2022 u/sec 21(c)/27/29 of NDPS Act r/w Section 27A Drugs & Cosmetics Act and investigation of the case was started. After completion of



the investigation, charge sheet was submitted against sole accused person namely Golam Ahammed Mirza @ Toton for commission of the offence punishable under section 21(c)/27A/29 of NDPS Act r/w Section 27A Drugs & Cosmetics Act.

3. After the charge sheet having been submitted, cognizance of the offence was taken and thereafter taking note of the available materials on record and upon hearing both sides, charge was framed against accused Golam Ahammed Mirza @ Toton on 20.01.2025 under section 21(c)/27A of NDPS Act.
4. The prosecution has examined ten (10) witnesses in this case in order to bring home the guilt of the accused person as alleged. After completion of examination of prosecution witnesses, accused person was examined under section 313 of the Code of Criminal Procedure. The accused person did not adduce any evidence on his behalf to prove his innocence.
5. Thereafter, Ld. Special P. P as well as the Ld. Defence Counsel advanced arguments in support of their respective cases. As it appears from the statement of the accused person recorded under section 313 of the Code of Criminal Procedure and from the trend of cross-examination of the witnesses of the prosecution, the case of the defence is one of denial and innocence of the accused person and that no such Phensedyl was recovered from the possession of the accused person and the accused person has been falsely implicated in this case.
6. **Points for Consideration**
 - i. Has the accused person namely Golam Ahammed Mirza @ Toton committed the offence punishable under section 21(c)/27A of NDPS Act ?
 - ii. Is the above noted accused person liable to be punished accordingly?



Decision and findings of the court

7. PW1 SI Tapas Saha admitted in his chief that on 10.02.2022 he was posted at Golapganj IC under Kaliachak PS as SI of police. On that date about 5:45 p.m he received one source information to the fact that some narcotic racketeers got assembled in the house of Golam Ahamed Mirja @ Totan for the purpose of dealing with narcotic substance. Then he diarized the same vide GDE No.364 dated 10.02.2022. At that point of time the I/C Kaliachak was vacant and accordingly he shared the information to the then DSP, HQ, Malda. Said DSP, HQ, Malda then authorized him to conduct raid in said house to work out said information. As per said authorization he formed one raiding team consisting of ASI Abdul Khabir, C/1023 Sk Sadi Sk, Civic Volunteer/Soumitra Singha, CV/Rakesh Singha, CV/Debasish Das, CV/Shyam Das and CV/Ayatullah Khomani to work out said information. They left Golapganj IC at about 06:40 pm vide GDE No.368 dated 10.02.2022 and reached the PO, about 7:05 p.m. When they arrived in front of said house they saw assembly of many people. Said village was known as the village of dealing of narcotic substance and people generally assemble to resist the raiding team if any raid is conducted in that village. However, they somehow managed to scatter said assembly and tried to ensure the attendance of some local independent witnesses but none was willing to become witness of the tentative search, recovery and seizure. Then they entered into that house and they surprisingly saw that there was nobody in that house, perhaps all of them fled away. Then they started searching of said house. At the right direction from the entrance gate at room No.03 they found two nylon sacks being tied with rope. On opening of those two sacks it was found that one of those sacks was containing 300 Nos. of phensedyl bottles and in another sack there was 100 Nos. of phensedyl bottles. Then they seized those contraband phensedyl bottles and got those seized alamats duly sealed and labelled. The process of seizure was commenced from 8:20 p.m and it was ended at about 9:45 p.m. Then they



carried those seized alampats to I/C Kaliachak In-charge. Then SI Tapas Saha lodged complaint to the then incharge of Kaliachak P.S and he handed over the seized phensedyl bottles to Malkhana In-charge of Kalliachak PS. He proved the written complaint as Exbt-P1, the seizure list as Exbt-P2, copy of GD Nos364, 368 dated 10.02.2022 as Exbt-P3 series and he identified the seized alampats in court.

In cross-examination he stated that he does not find any authorization in the court and that he did not in writing inform his superior officer within 72 hrs of receiving of said information and he also did not inform his superior in writing within 48 hrs of search, recovery and seizure. He further admitted that during the course of search, recovery and seizure he did not try to ensure the attendance of any Executive Magistrate or Gazetted officer and all the witnesses of seizure were police personnel and were raiding team members. He also stated that he did not in writing serve any notice upon any local resident's to become witness of the tentative search, recovery and seizure. He also admitted that he did not seize any electric bill or any ownership document of said house wherein the alleged raid was conducted. He further admitted that prior to entering into said house he did not obtain any consent from any person. He further stated that no lady police personnel accompanied the raiding team. He also stated that the alleged PO is situated near to Golapganj I.C. He stated that the original GDE book does not contain specific name of any PS or Investigation Center to which said GDE book belong to. He also stated that there is no note in the GD entry that after having received the source information he intimated the same to DSP, HQ, Malda. He further submitted that he did not mention camp at Mohabbatpur and date, time and place at the bottom of his signature on the label. He admitted labels do not bear the name of the maker of allegedly seized phensedyl) bottles.

8. PW 2 ASI Abdul Khabir admitted in chief that on 10.02.2022 he was posted at Golapganj IC under Kaliachak PS as ASI of police and on that date he



accompanied SI Tapas Saha and force to Mohabbatpur Jamshed Tola for the purpose of conducting raid in connection with dealing of phensedyl bottles in one house and they reached the house of Golam Ahamed Mirja and cordoned that house and entered into that house. There was one lady in that house. They were searching different rooms of that house. Said lady identified one room which belonged to Golam Ahamed Mirja and during the process of searching of that room two nylon sacks were found and on opening of those two sacks it was found that there were total 400 bottles of phensedyl in those two sacks. Then SI Tapas Saha seized those contraband phensedyl bottles contained in two sacks in his presence. Those seized alamats were duly labelled. He proved his signature on the seizure list as Exbt-P2/1 and on two labels as Exbt-MOIII/I and Exbt-MO IV/I.

During Cross-examination PW 2 stated that he was not authorized in writing to accompany the raiding team. He further stated that he along with SI Tapas Saha reached to the PO by riding same vehicle. He also stated that there was one lady police personnel who accompanied the raiding team but he cannot recollect the name. He also stated that he cannot recollect the name of driver who drove the police vehicle to the PO. He further stated that he cannot tell the names of the residents whose house's were situated surrounding to the house of Golam Ahamed Mirja. He admitted that he himself did not serve any notice upon any local residents to become witness of the tentative search, recovery and seizure process. He also admitted that prior to commencement of searching process the persons of police personnel was not searched by any people. He cannot tell any plot No. Dag No. or respective mouza wherein said house is situated. He further stated that he did not mention any date and time at the bottom of his signature on the seizure list and on the label. The IO of this case did not seize any command certificate from him and he cannot produce his command certificate. He cannot tell about the number of rooms of that house and the name of the person's to whom those rooms belonged to. He



admitted that no ownership document of alleged house was seized in his presence.

9. PW 3 Civic Volunteer Soumitra Singha corroborated the evidence of PW and proved his signature on the seizure as Exbt-P2/2 and labels as Exbt-MOIII/II and Exbt-IV/II.

In cross-examination he stated that it was well within his knowledge that Civic Volunteer cannot be engaged in law and order duty or any special raid and his superior did not authorize him in writing to be the member of the raiding team. He admitted that Mohabbatpur is situated by the side of his native village Golapganj and he did not put any date and time at the bottom of his signature on the seizure list and he cannot tell about the contents of either seizure list or label.

10. PW 4 Civic Volunteer Rakesh Singha deposed that on 10.02.2022 he accompanied the raiding team led by SI Tapas Saha who recovered 400 bottles of phensedyl and he proved his signature on the seizure as Exbt-P2/3 and labels as Exbt-MOIII/III and Exbt-IV/III.

In cross-examination he admitted that the accused persons and house of accused person were known to him prior to the alleged incident and no villager of Mohabbatpur was called at the PO by serving notice upon him/them in writing and the Panchayat Pradhan or any respectable or renowned person of the locality was/were not called at the PO. He cannot tell about the contents of the seizure list. He put his signature on the seizure list outside the house of the accused person. He further admitted that the label on which he put his signature was not affixed over any document and the same was in the loose form and no date, time and place have been assigned by him at the bottom of his signatures. The IO of this case did not seize any document from him in respect of the fact that he was on duty on that very date. He was never



interrogated by any person in connection with this case and he was stating about the incident for the first time before this court.

11. PW5 Civic Volunteer Ayatullah Khomeni corroborated the evidence of PW 4 and proved his signature on the seizure list as Exbt-P2/4.

In cross-examination he admitted that he cannot tell about the topography of the PO and he cannot recollect as to whether any villager of Mohabbatpur was called at the PO by serving notice upon him/them in writing or not and as to whether the Panchayat Pradhan or any respectable or renowned person of the locality was/were called at the PO or not and he cannot tell about the contents of the seizure list. He further admitted that he put his signature on the seizure list outside the house of the accused person and no date, time and place have been assigned by him at the bottom of his signatures and he cannot tell as to whether the IO of this case seized any document from him in respect of the fact that he was on duty on that very date or not.

12. PW6 Constable Md Sekh Sadi SK also corroborated the evidence of PW 5 and proved his signature on the seizure list as Exbt-P2/5.

In cross-examination he admitted that he cannot produce any document to substantiate that he was on duty on that very date and the IO of this case did not seize such document from him and he cannot tell about the topography of the PO. He further admitted that no person from nearby house was called at the PO as witness and no document was either perused or seized by SI Tapas Saha regarding the ownership of the house and no lady police personnel was in the raiding team and that no date, time and place have been assigned by him at the bottom of his signature on the seizure list.

13. PW 7 Civic Volunteer Shyam Das stated that on 10.02.2022 he was a member of the raid party led by SI Tapas Saha and reached Jamshednagar



Mohabbatpur at about 8:30 p.m and cordoned the house which belonged to Golam Ahammed Mirja @ Toton who fled away from the house while they were cordoning the house and they came to know that the person who fled away was Golam Ahammed Mirja. In course of raid some contraband phensedyl bottles were seized by SI Tapas Saha and returned to Golapganj I.C taking the seized contraband phensedyl bottles.

In cross-examination he admitted that he cannot produce any document to substantiate that he was on duty on that very date and the IO of this case did not seize such document from him and he cannot tell about the topography of the PO house and he was not authorized in writing by the then I/C Kaliachak PS to accompany the raiding team and no document was either perused or seized by SI Tapas Saha regarding the ownership of the house and no lady police personnel was in the raiding team. He further admitted that they being police personnel did not get themselves personally searched by any person prior to commencement of searching process leading to recovery and during the course of search he was outside the main entrance gate of the house and the recovery leading to seizure was not conducted in his presence.

14. PW 8 Civic Volunteer Debasis Das stated that on 10.02.2022 he was a member of the raid party led by SI Tapas Saha and reached Jamshednagar Mohabbatpur at about 8:00/8:30 p.m and cordoned the house which belonged to Golam Ahammed Mirja @ Toton who fled away from the house while they were cordoning the house and they came to know that the person who fled away was Golam Ahammed Mirja. In course of raid 400 bottles of contraband phensedyl were seized by SI Tapas Saha and returned to Golapganj I.C taking the seized contraband phensedyl bottles.

In cross-examination he admitted that he cannot produce any document to substantiate that he was on duty on that very date and the IO of this case did not seize such document from him and he cannot tell about the topography of the PO house and he was not authorized in writing by the then I/C Kaliachak



PS to accompany the raiding team and no document was either perused or seized by SI Tapas Saha regarding the ownership of the house and no lady police personnel was in the raiding team. He further admitted that they being police personnel did not get themselves personally searched by any person prior to commencement of searching process leading to recovery and during the course of search he was outside the main entrance gate of the house and the recovery leading to seizure was not conducted in his presence.

15. PW 9 SI Sukumar Roy stated that on 10.02.2022 he was posted at Golapganj I.C under Kaliachak PS and was entrusted with the investigation of Kaliachak PS Case No.164 of 2022 dated 10.02.2022. In course of his investigation he visited the PO, prepared rough sketch map with index (marked as Exbt-P4 series), got the inventory process conducted through Ld JM, 3rd Court and proved the inventory report as Exbt-P5, proved the CFSL report as Exbt-P6, proved the original information slips issued by the BL & LRO Kaliachak-III as Exbt-P7 series. He also proved two envelopes containing samples as Exbt-MO VII, two other separate envelopes containing samples as Exbt-MO VIII series and two labels kept inside those two envelopes containing samples as Exbt-MO IX and MO X respectively.

In cross-examination he admitted that there is no note in the rough sketch map as to who identified the PO to him and no residents of surrounding areas of the PO was examined by him and he did not seize any authorization letter, GD book, vehicle register, Godown receipt, inventory list and Malkhana register and he did not examine any Gazetted Officer of Kaliachak PS. He further admitted that the information slips collected by him from BL & LRO office do not show that the land in question was recorded either in the name of the accused or his father and the CD does not reflect that Rajjak Miya was the grandfather of the accused and he did not collect any document regarding the chain of family members of Rajjak Miya and he did not collect any chain of



custody of the seized alamats during the period from 10.02.2022 to 11.04.2022.

16. PW10 SI Sukumar Ghosh deposed that on 22.02.2024 he was posted at Golapganj I.C as SI of police and was entrusted with further investigation of Kaliachak PS Case No.164 of 2022 dated 10.02.2022 and in course of his investigation he conducted jail gate interrogation of accused Golam Ahammed Mirja, collected information from BL & LRO Kaliachak -III regarding ownership of the house wherefrom contraband phensedyl bottles were recovered and on completion of investigation he submitted charge sheet against the accused whom he identified through V.C.

In cross-examination he denied the suggestion that he submitted the charge sheet after conducting his part of investigation in a perfunctory manner.

17. Ld. Special P.P. submitted that the search and seizure took place in the house of the Golam Ahmmed Mirza @ Toton and mandatory provisions of the NDPS Act have been complied with by the seizing officer. The FIR, seizure list, label and CFSL Report have been exhibited by the prosecution and BL & LRO Report has also been exhibitted. It is further submitted by the Ld. P. P. that huge quantity of narcotic drugs i.e 400 bottles of Phensedyl were seized in this case. The Special P.P. also argued that the presumption U/S 35 and section 54 of the NDPS Act have been proved by the prosecution.

18. In course of argument Ld. Defence Counsel submitted that the mandatory provision of sections 42, 50, 52, 52(A), 55 of NDPS Act have not been complied with by the prosecution and the evidence of the official witness U/S 100, 165 and 172 of Cr.P.C have not been followed by the prosecution. During cross-examination of PW 1 stated that no Gazetted Officer as well as independent witness was called upon during search and seizure process. He also admitted that he did not collect any authorization and he did not inform



his superior officer in writing within 72 hours from receiving of said information and also did not inform his immediate superior after search and seizure within 48 hours. PW1 also stated that he did not serve any notice or collect any ownership document of the alleged house. He also stated that he did not mention in the GD entry that in which mode he gathered the source information. During examination-in-chief PW3 stated that the alleged date of occurrence and seizure was 10/03/2022. During examination-in-chief PW4 and PW 5 admitted that they were not present at the time of seizure as they remained outside of the alleged house and they also failed to tell the contents of the seizure list on which they put their signatures. Moreover, except PW 10, none of the prosecution witness has identified the alleged accused person. During cross examination the Investigating Officer failed to adduce any satisfactory answer regarding the ownership of the alleged house.

19. I have heard argument of both sides at length, perused the evidence and materials on record, exhibited documents. It is the case of the prosecution that 400 bottles of Phensedyl was recovered from the house of the sold accused Golam Ahammed Mirja @ Toton. The mandatory provision of Section 42 of NDPS Act have not been complied in this case. The source information has not been informed to the higher authority and no authorization has been collected. No independent witness was present at the time of alleged search and seizure in the residential house. Moreover no lady police personnel was present at the time of alleged search and seizure.

20. PW 3 stated that the incident of the case took place on 10.03.2022, though the alleged incident took place on 10.02.2022. So it may be inferred that the PW 3 actually did not take part in the process of search and seizure. Most of the witnesses failed to describe the topography of the alleged house from where recovery of 400 bottles of Phensedyl was made. In the case in hand, there is complete disobedience to the mandatory provision of NDPS Act. Moreover,



the prosecution witnesses starting from PW 1 to PW9 failed to identify the accused person of this case. The IO collected the documents of BL & LRO office Kaliachak-III but failed to connect the accused person with the said document to establish that the accused person is actually the owner of the alleged house where the raid was conducted and 400 bottles of Phensedyl was recovered.

21. Under such above facts and circumstances of this case, this court is compelled to come to the conclusion that the prosecution has miserably failed to prove the prosecution case against the accused person as alleged and the accused is entitled to get the benefit of doubt.

22. Hence it is

Ordered

that the sole accused person namely **Golam Ahammed Mirza @ Toton** is not found guilty of the offence punishable under section 21(c)/27A of NDPS Act and he is acquitted of this case under section 235 (1) of Code of Criminal Procedure.

The accused person namely **Golam Ahammed Mirza @ Toton** is directed to furnish bond of Rs.6,000/- with two registered sureties of Rs.3,000/- each, subject to the satisfaction of the Ld. CJM, Malda.

The accused person namely **Golam Ahammed Mirza @ Toton** be released at once, if he is not wanted in any other case, subject to furnishing of the bail bond as noted above.

The bail bond of accused person shall remain in force till next 6 months period from the date of passing of this Judgment as per section 437A of Cr.P.C.

The alat in this case be confiscated to the State and destroyed in accordance with law after the expiry of period of appeal only in case of no appeal being filed.
