Order No. 02 dated 07-03-2026

This is an application u/s 482 of B.N.S.S. filed on behalf of the present petitioners namely, 1. Jamal Sk., 2. Motibur @ Mahammad Ali and 3. Nurul Sekh in connection with Baishnabnagar P.S. Case No. 21/2026 dated 06.01.2026 under Sections 111(2)/111(4)/317(2)/317(4) of B.N.S. Read with Section 11 of Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act, 1960. The said application is taken up for hearing.

Before proceeding with hearing the said application, this Court specifically queried from the Ld. Advocate representing the present petitioners as to whether any other similar application is pending in either the Hon'ble Court, Calcutta or in the Hon'ble Supreme Court. This Court further queried whether there has been any earlier rejection of any application for bail in an earlier occasion by the Hon'ble High Court or the Hon'ble Supreme Court.

The Ld. District P.P. as well as the Ld. Advocate representing the present petitioners submitted that no such application is pending and/or there is no order of rejection from either the Hon'ble High Court, Calcutta or the Hon'ble Supreme Court.

The Ld. Advocate representing the present petitioners submits that the petitioners herein are innocent and they have been falsely implicated in the instant case. They have no nexus with the offence as alleged. He, therefore, prays for anticipatory bail in respect of the present petitioners on any condition.

The learned District P.P. submits that the instant case is indeed a serious one and allowing the prayer for anticipatory bail would highly prejudice the prosecution. He, therefore, prays for rejection of the prayer for anticipatory bail.

Ld. Advocate representing the present petitioners and the Ld. District P.P. is heard at length.

Perused the LCR and CD.

Upon perusal of the CD and LCR it appears that the instant case has been arisen out of one complaint made by one S.I. Rupam Ghosh of Baishnabnagar P.S. regarding smuggling of cattle and cruelty upon them. It also appears that the police had already recovered and seized 8 nos. of cows but not from the possession of the present accused-petitioner. No particular allegation is made by the defacto complainant against this accused-petitioners. So, I do not find any reason to warrant the custodial interrogation of the accused-petitioners. Accordingly, the prayer for anticipatory bail is hereby allowed.

Hence, it is

O R D E R E D

that in the event of arrest the present petitioners namely, 1. Jamal Sk., 2. Motibur @ Mahammad Ali and 3. Nurul Sekh shall be released upon furnishing bail bond of **Rs. 10,000/- each with two sureties of Rs. 5,000/- each one of which must be local**, subject to satisfaction of the Arresting Officer. If on bail they will comply the provision u/s 482(2) of B.N.S.S. **The accused-petitioners are also directed to meet the I.O. twice in a week till submission of charge-sheet.**

In addition to the same the accused-petitioners are directed to surrender before the appropriate Court and pray for regular bail within a fortnight from date.

Return the L.C.R and the C.D.

The Crl. Misc. Case is thus disposed of.
