Order No. 07 dated 24.06.2026:

Today is fixed for passing order.

Petitioner **Subrata Sarkar** is present filing by attendance through her Ld. Counsel.
Heard the Ld. Counsel for petitioner.

Considered the submissions and perused the record.

The case record is taken up for the above purpose.

This is a suit filed by the petitioner u/s 25 of Special Marriage Act 1954 for dissolution of his marriage with the respondent, by a decree of divorce on the ground of cruelty .

The marriage between the petitioner and respondent was registered on **28.05.2023** under the Special Marriage Act before Marriage Officer Pampa Biswas. Prior to said registry marriage negotiation had taken place among the family members of both the parties and it was mutually decided that the social marriage would be held after a few months and till the ceremony of the social marriage of the parties, they would live separately at their respective paternal house. In the meantime, all on a sudden, the father of the petitioner died on 24.09.2023 and 'Ashouch' was started and continued for next one year and the petitioner requested the parents of the respondent to postpone social marriage for next one year and later on as the petitioner failed to do social marriage so the respondent side used to humiliate and used to insult the petitioner. The parties are living separately after registration of the marriage and there was no point to continue the marital relationship and the cause of action took place on 28.01.2023.

The Respondent **Rituparna Sarkar** after receiving of summon did not turn up and hence the instant suit was slated for exparte hearing.

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The petitioner, **Subrata Sarkar** examined himself as P.W.-1. He submitted his examination in chief on affidavit and by tendering the same on the dock conveyed and corroborated his case, as made out in the plaint and the factum of cruelty and desertion by the respondent **Rituparna Sarkar**. The original marriage certificate being no. 66376 dated 28.05.2023 issued by the Marriage Officer Pampa Biswas already marked as **Exhibit P1**. The oral testimony of the petitioner as P.W.-1 remains unchallenged and uncontroverted from any quarter.

In absence of any contrary and controverting evidence on record and as the evidence of the petitioner as PW1 remains unchallenged and un-controverted, this Court finds its apt to allow the prayer of the petitioner, filed u/s 25 of Special Marriage Act 1954 for divorce on the ground of cruelty.

C.F paid is correct.

Hence it is,

ORDERED

That the application u/s. 25 of Special Marriage Act 1954 filed on 23.12.2024 being MAT Suit no 1186/2024 (CIS 323/2026) is allowed exparte against the respondent **Rituparna Sarkar**, and without any order as to costs.

The marriage registered between the parties namely **Subrata Sarkar and Rituparna Sarkar** on **28.05.2023** under section 25 of Special Marriage Act, 1954 is hereby dissolved by decree of divorce with effect from this day.

The original marriage certificate being no. 66376 dated 28.05.2023 issued by the Marriage Officer Pampa Biswas stands canceled with immediate effect.

Let a copy of this order be given free of cost to the petitioner **Subrata Sarkar**.

Decree be drawn up accordingly.
