Suit for permanent injunction restraining the defendant and his privies, associates, attorneys representatives, agents, employees relatives etc. from misusing and misappropriating the blank cheques of

the plaintiff bearing cheque no. 887091 and 887092 after forging/ propounding the signatures of plaintiff over the same either himself or through any other person and also not to file any false and frivolous complaint before the police or before the court by way of misusing the above said blank cheques and further not to raise any false and frivolous claim against the plaintiff on the basis of those blank cheques and also not to cause any loss to the life and liberty of the plaintiff and also restraining from raising any illegal demand from the plaintiff and from filing any false frivolous complaint against the plaintiff.

JUDGMENT:-

1. The Brief facts from which the present suit emnates are that the plaintiff and defendant were earlier jointly doing the work of net marketing and were having good friendly relations with each other and they were family friends. About two month ago some dispute arose between the parties due to joint business and as such they stopped working with each other jointly and got separated their work from each other. However, after separation of the work the business of plaintiff was running well, but the

defendant started suffering losses in his business due to lack of knowledge and as such ultimately again defendant started pressurizing the plaintiff to restart the joint business with him, but when the plaintiff refused to do so, upon this the defendant started threatening that he has taken away two blank cheques of the plaintiff in a stealthily manner and further started pressurizing the plaintiff to restart the joint business with defendant otherwise he will misuse the said blank cheques no. 887091 and 887092 by way of forging the signatures of the plaintiff.

2. Thereafter on coming to know about this fact, the plaintiff has received great shock and he immediately gave instructions to his concerned bank to stop the payment of both the said cheques and the plaintiff also requested the defendant not to misuse the said bank cheques after forging the signatures of the plaintiff and not to indulge the plaintiff into any false litigation and also requested him to return both the above said blank cheques to the plaintiff, but defendant did not pay any heed towards such requests of the plaintiff and rather started threatening the plaintiff with dire consequences.

3. Now the defendant is raising illegal demands from the plaintiff and started interfering into the peaceful life of the plaintiff and also threatening to misuse the above said blank cheques of the plaintiff on the blank cheques. The plaintiff requested the defendant to desist from his nefarious designs and illegal activities, but the defendant did not pay any heed to the said requests of the plaintiff and rather on the contrary further threatened the plaintiff with dire consequences in the manner as stated above and also started threatening to misuse and misappropriate the said

blank cheques after forging/ propounding the signatures of the plaintiff over the same either himself or through other person and also threatening to file false and frivolous complaint before the police or before the court by way of misusing the above said blank cheques and will raise false claim against the plaintiff.

Hence necessitating to filing of the present suit.

Notice to the accused:-

4. Upon notice defendant did not come present hence proceeded against exparte.

Plaintiff Evidence:-

5. The matter was fixed for evidence of the plaintiff after which as many as numerous effective opportunities were granted to the plaintiff but no PW was ever examined by the plaintiff. Finally after granting last opportunity this court did not find any sufficient reason to further adjourn the case as such the suit stands dismissed u/o 17 rule 3 CPC. File complete in all aspects be consigned to record room.
