The petitioner is present before this court.

It appears from the record that OP appeared on 25-11-2025 but subsequently, he did not turn up So, the case was proceeded exparte against him.

The petitioner has also filed affidavit-in-chief in respect of herself. Let it be kept with the record.

Heard Ld. Lawyer for the petitioner. The petitioner Pramita Mallick @ Pramita Mondal is examined as P.W.1. The case record is now taken up for passing exparte order.

This is a suit for divorce on the ground of cruelty u/s. 13(1) of Hindu Marriage Act, 1955, filed by petitioner/ wife namely, Pramita Mallick @ Pramita Mondal against her husband/ respondent namely, Arabinda Mondal.

In order to prove her case, the petitioner has examined herself as P.W.-1. Perused the exparte evidence of P.W.-1.

The petitioner has stated that the marriage in between the petitioner and respondent was solemnized on 05-03-2006 and after marriage they started their conjugal life at the house of the respondent. After few years of the marriage, the relation in between the parties had been broken down due to ill temperament and misbehavior of the respondent. The respondent used to pick up quarrel with the petitioner over trifling issues. The respondent subjected her to cruelty both physically and mentally over the post marital demand of dowry. Thereafter, in the month of December, 2016, the petitioner was driven out from her matrimonial home. The evidence of PW-1 is unchallenged testimony and there is no reason to disbelieve the same. On careful perusal of the evidence of petitioner, it appears that the petitioner's case for divorce on the ground of cruelty has been proved by her exparte evidence. So, petitioner is entitled to get a decree of divorce on the ground of cruelty.

In the result, the suit succeeds exparte.

C.F paid is correct.

Hence, it is Ordered

that Mat. Suit No. 121 of 2025 be and the same is decreed ex-parte as against respondent without any order as to cost.

The petitioner namely, Pramita Mallick @ Pramita Mondal do get a decree of divorce against the respondent namely, Arabinda Mondal.

The Matrimonial tie in between the petitioner and the respondent, namely Pramita Mallick @ Pramita Mondal and Arabinda Mondal is hereby dissolved by a decree of divorce.

The decree of divorce shall take effect from this date.
