

**Criminal Misc. Case No. 219 of 2026**

**Order No. 02**

**09.03.2026**

This is an application under Section 482 of BNSS, filed by the accused/ petitioners namely; **1. Sarif Ansary and 2. Kaizar Ansary**, praying for anticipatory bail apprehending their arrest, in connection with Arsha, P.S Case No. 10 of 2026 dated 22.02.2026 under Section 126(2)/118(2)/303(2)/351(2)/3(5) of BNS, vide G.R. Case No. 348 of 2026.

Heard the bail prayer made by the Ld. Lawyer for the accused.

Ld. Lawyer for the accused submits that no bail application has been filed/pending before the Hon'ble High court, Calcutta.

Perused the CD and other materials on record.

Heard the Ld. P.P. who raises objection.

Having consulting with the case record as well as the materials on the case diary, it appears that the dispute between the victim and the accused persons was cropped up concerning the landed properties and there is contradiction on the material point between the contents of the written complaint and the history of assault recorded by the doctor as revealed from the page nos. 2,15, 22 and 25 of the C.D. Considering the entire scenario, I find that the custodial interrogation of the accused persons for the purpose of investigation is not required and therefore, I am inclined to allow the anticipatory bail in favour of the accused persons.

In the event of arrest, the accused petitioners be released, on furnishing bond of Rs.5000/- each with two registered sureties of Rs. 2500/- each, to the satisfaction of the arresting officer and on compliance with the conditions as envisaged u/s 482(2) of BNSS.

The Criminal Misc. Case is, thus disposed of. Return the C.D.
