**This is bail application under Section 482 of BNSS r/w Section 438  
Cr. P.C. moved on behalf of applicant/accused Prashant Kumar Singh  
for grant of anticipatory bail.**

1. IO has filed his report. Copy supplied.
2. Arguments are heard on the anticipatory bail application of  
the accused.
3. As per report of the IO accused was already given two  
notices under Section 41 Cr. P. C. on 11.07.2024 and 04.08.2024. It is

submitted that one police officer has also went to the house of the accused. The accused has allegedly forged the signature of the complainant in the Guarantor Form and the photograph is also of third party and not of the complainant. NBWs were also taken against the accused on 14.11.2024 and it is submitted that process under Section 82 Cr. P. C. are already taken against the accused. Learned Counsel for the accused has submitted that accused could not appear as there was death in the family of the accused/ son of Taya of the accused. IO has submitted that NBWs were received against the accused on 14.11.2024 returnable on 08.01.2025. It is submitted by learned Counsel for the accused that son of Taya of the accused has expired on 08.01.2025 regarding which the death certificate dated 10.01.2025 is also filed from Municipality, Varanasi, Uttar Pradesh. It is submitted that the accused has already made the payment of the entire loan and the email dated 21.12.2024 from NBFC is received and in the mail it is submitted that the guarantee is only for personal identification and it does not take any financial details. However the legal implication of this letter is subject matter of trial. Accused has failed to join the investigation despite issuance of NBWs and process under Section 82 Cr. P. C. against the accused. In view of which at this stage of proceedings I am not inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the accused. According the bail application of the accused Prashant Kumar Singh is dismissed.

Nothing expressed herein shall be construed as expression of opinion of the Court on the merits of the case.
