

Criminal Misc. Case No. 481 of 2026

This is an application under Section 482 of BNSS, filed by the accused/ petitioners namely; **1. Rakesh Kumar, 2. Raj Kishore Kumar, 3. Rabi Kumar, 4. Hiralal Kumar, 5. Pahalan Kumar, 6. Dhiren Kumar, 7. Ambika Kumar and 8. Chanchala Kumar**, praying for anticipatory bail apprehending their arrest, in connection with Arsha P.S Case No. 29 of 2026 dated 14.05.2026 under Sections 329(4)/117(2)/118(2)/324(4)/352/3(5) of BNS, vide G.R. Case No. 812 of 2026.

The prayer for anticipatory bail is moved by the Ld. Lawyer for the accused petitioners.

Ld. Lawyer for the accused submits that no bail application has been filed/pending before the Hon'ble High Court, Calcutta. The present accused petitioners are innocent and falsely implicated in this case. There is a case and counter case between the parties. Accordingly, Ld. Lawyer for the accused prays for bail.

Ld. P.P. opposes the bail prayer

Considered the submissions made by both the sides.

Perused the T.C.R., F.I.R and CD.

So far the accused petitioners no.1,2,3,4,5,6 namely **Rakesh Kumar, Raj Kishore Kumar, Rabi Kumar, Hiralal Kumar, Pahalan Kumar and Dhiren Kumar**, are concerned, there is specific allegation against them. Considering the direct allegation against them, the Court is not inclined to grant the anticipatory bail to these accused. So, the prayer for anticipatory bail in respect of accused petitioners no.1,2,3,4,5,6 namely **Rakesh Kumar, Raj Kishore Kumar, Rabi Kumar, Hiralal Kumar, Pahalan Kumar and Dhiren Kumar**, stands **rejected**.

So far as the other accused petitioners no.**7. Ambika Kumar and 8. Chanchala Kumar**, there is no specific allegation against them and it does not appear that their custodial interrogation would be needed for the purpose of investigation. Accordingly, the prayer for anticipatory bail is considered and **allowed**.

Hence, in the event of arrest, the accused petitioners namely, **7. Ambika Kumar and 8. Chanchala Kumar**, be released, on furnishing bond of Rs. 3000/- each with two sureties of Rs. 1500/- each, to the satisfaction of the arresting officer and on compliance with the conditions as envisaged u/s 482(2) of BNSS.

The Criminal Misc. Case is, thus disposed of. Return the C.D.
