Deputed IO has filed the conviction report. As per conviction report of both the accused, they are not previously convicted for the same offence.

Ld. Substitute APP accepts the notice on behalf of State.

Heard. Perused the record.

Let the accused persons be examined in-camera.

After examining both the accused persons In-Camera, Court is satisfied that the application for Plea-Bargaining has been filed by accused persons voluntarily and without any undue pressure and coercion.

Accused, Ld. Substitute APP for State and substitute IO after having meeting to enter a satisfactory disposition of the case have reported to the Court that a satisfactory disposition of the case has been worked out between the parties, wherein accused persons voluntarily agree to plead guilty for offence U/s 4(c), The Delhi Prevention of Touting and Malpractices against Tourist Act and Ld. Substitute APP for State & IO have raised no objection for the same with a prayer that both accused persons may be dealt as per law.

Court has heard the mutual satisfactory disposition of case worked, out by the parties, the process of which has been completed voluntarily by the parties. Court is satisfied that there is no impediment to dispose of the present case through plea-bargaining.

In view of the mutual satisfactory disposition of the case in the plea bargaining and after hearing the parties, both the accused persons stand convicted for the offence punishable U/s 4(c), The Delhi Prevention of Touting and Malpractices against Tourist Act.

Heard on sentence.

The convicts are sentenced to pay a fine of Rs.500/- each. Fine stands paid.
Let receipt be issued.

08.03.2025.
