The record is taken up today at the instance of a put up petition filed on behalf of the petitioner.

An application under Section 12 of the Guardians and Wards Act, 1890, has been filed on behalf of the petitioner/father.

Ld. Advocate for the petitioner/father prays for hearing of the application under Section 12 of the Guardians and Wards Act, 1890, in respect of the ad-interim prayer of visitation.

As per office report, no caveat has been filed.

As such, the application under Section 12 of the Guardians and Wards Act, 1890, is taken up for hearing.

Heard the submissions made on behalf of the petitioner/father.

Perused the record.

Considered.

Ld. Advocate for the petitioner, at this stage, has only prayed for a direction for visitation right on virtual mode, which is an innocuous prayer.

The fact that the petitioner is the father of the child is, *prima facie*, made out from the Birth Certificate of the minor child, namely, Tanish Sarkar.

Accordingly, I am inclined to allow the prayer for ad-interim visitation by the petitioner/father in respect of the minor child, namely, Tanish Sarkar, however in a virtual manner till the next date.

Hence,

it is,

ORDERED

that the prayer for an order of ad-interim visitation is allowed in favour of the petitioner/father till **06.01.2026 (as Winter Vacation intervenes)**.

The petitioner/father is given liberty to interact with his son, Tanish Sarkar, once in a week, preferably on Sunday, between 05:00 P.M to 06:00 P.M., through video-conference till 06.01.2026.

The respondent/mother is directed to make necessary arrangements for such video conference, through WhatsApp or any other digital platform.

The respondent/mother is, further, directed to allow the petitioner/father to interact with his minor son comfortably without putting any force or undue influence.

The petitioner/father and the respondent/mother, being parents, are expected to maintain proper decorum and to allow the minor son to virtually communicate with his father as per the direction of this Court.

Requisite put in.

Issue the same at once.
