Today is fixed for appearance, reconciliation and hearing of the Matrimonial Suit.

Both the petitioners are present, duly represented by their respective Ld lawyers.

Both the petitioners are called on dock and an effort is made to settle their matrimonial disputes amicably but both parties submitted on dock that there is no scope of their reunion and any further lingering would increase their bitterness. As there is no scope of reunion the case is taken up for final hearing.

Both the petitioners file their respective Examination -in -chief on Affidavit under Order 18 Rule 4 CPC along with some documents by Firisthi.

Both the petitioners are examined on dock as PW 1 and 2 respectively and discharged. During the evidence of the parties, the Marriage Certificate , Birth Certificate of Shreyan Malo and copy of their respective Aadhaar Cards are marked as **Exhibit Nos.1 to 4** respectively.

Heard Ld lawyers at length. Perused the materials on record.

The petitioners by filing the joint petition U/s 28 of the Special Marriage Act, 1954 have stated that petitioner No.1 is legally married wife of petitioner No. 2. The marriage was registered on **15.04.2013** as per Special Marriage Act vide Marriage Registration Certificate Serial No 47/2013, Certificate book page no 1396 . Later marriage was also held as per Hindu Rites and Customs in presence of friends and relatives. After marriage the petitioner No.1/wife went to her matrimonial home where the marriage was duly consummated and in the said wedlock one male child namely Shreyan Malo was born on 19.03.2015. That due to differences of taste and culture and the disputes which cropped up between the parties, which could not be reconciled, the parties were forced to reside separately from each other since 25.05.2023 and later compelling them to file the instant petition praying for divorce on mutual consent on 24.11.2025 U/s 28 of the Special Marriage Act, 1954, so 6 months have been elapsed from the date of presentation of the petition. It has been further stated that there is no connivance or collusion in between the parties to file this suit and the petitioner/wife also has no claim against her husband/petitioner No.2. It further appears that out of free consent they filed the petition and the consent is true and voluntarily given, as per their averment.

I have therefore, no reason to disallow the prayer of the parties.

C.F. has been correctly paid.

It is accordingly,

ORDERED

that the petition under Section 28 of the Special Marriage Act. Dated 24.11.2025 is allowed. Marriage registered between the parties on **15.04.2013** as per Special Marriage Act vide Marriage Registration Certificate Serial No 47/2013, Certificate book page no 1396 is hereby dissolved by decree of divorce on mutual consent with effect from this the 03rd day of June 2026 and the Marriage Registration Certificate be cancelled.
