**First** Bail application under Section 482 BNSS

**ORDER**

Vide instant order, this Court shall dispose of bail application filed by applicant/accused under Section 482 BNSS seeking anticipatory bail in afore-mentioned FIR.

2. Notice of the bail application served upon the State. Police record produced. Police record produced. ASI-Shankar Singh produced his report.

3. In accordance with record, FIR in hand stood registered at the instance of informant/injured Kunan Singh, who has reported that on dated

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29.10.2025 while he alongwith his son namely Amandeep Singh were performing *sewa* in the Gurudwara Sahib, a plant got damaged. Hence, it was thrown by his son. On seeing the same, Akashdeep Singh, who came at the spot at about 2:00 PM started abusing them. However, they were pacified by the mediators. It is alleged that later on, Akashdeep Singh started throwing brick-bats on their house that resulted in causing damage to their glasses. At about 5:30 PM, while the informant alongwith his son was going to their village from Rayya, then Akashdeep Singh armed with *dattar*, Bhupiner Singh armed with base-ball, Kuldeep Singh (applicant) armed with *dang* alongwith 2/3 unknown persons stopped them near Baba Mahesh Sheller. Akashdeep Singh gave push blow to the informant as a result thereof, he fell on the ground. He also inflicted injury with the help of *dattar* on his left shin. He was also inflicted blows on his arms and right shoulder by Bhupinder Singh with baseball. Kuldeep Singh inflicted *dang* blow on his shoulders and left knee. The son of informant intervened to rescue him. He was also inflicted three baseball blows by Bhupinder Singh on his left palm, right wrist and left arm. Kuldeep Singh also inflicted *dang* blow on his back and right hand. The unknown assailants damaged their motorcycle. Thereafter, all of them escaped from the scene of occurrence on their car. Injury no.1 that is incised wound suffered by the informant on his left leg has been declared grievous, whereas, the other injuries have been declared simple in nature.

On the other hand, vide his separate statement got recorded by Parampreet Kaur on dated 11.11.2025, she has reported that on 29.10.2025

Amandeep Singh has intentionally plucked the plants planted by them in the Gurudwara Sahib. When she tried to inquire the reasons thereof, he started arguing with her but they were pacified by the respectables. On the same evening at about 5:00 PM, on hearing *raul*, she came out of her house and saw that her brother namely Akashdeep Singh was being beaten by Amandeep Singh, Kunan Singh and Surinder Kaur. She intervened to rescue her brother but applicant Surinder Kaur caught her hair and thrown her on the earth. Kunan Singh gave her slap blow. Amandeep Singh also grappled with her and torn her suit. After some time, when she was going alongwith her cousin Kuldeep Singh, Bhupinder Singh and Akashdeep Singh to report the incident, they were intervened by Amandeep Singh and his father. Akashdeep Singh was inflicted injuries by them. Accordingly, cross-case was registered vide DDR no.20, dated 11.11.2025.

4. Learned counsel for the applicant has argued that alleged occurrence took place on dated 29.10.2025 and FIR got registered on dated 03.11.2025 i.e. after delay of five days. It is result of due deliberations and consultation. Applicant has been falsely implicated in the instant case under political influence. The applicant is ready and willing to join investigation. Accordingly, he has prayed for grant of anticipatory bail to the applicant.

On the other hand, learned Additional Public Prosecutor for the State has opposed the bail application and prayed for dismissal of bail application.

5. Heard. Apparently, there is delay of five days in registration of FIR in hand, however, the informant was admitted in the hospital on the date

of alleged incident itself. The injuries attributed to the applicant are simple in nature. Injury no.1 that has been declared grievous has been attributed to co-accused Akashdeep Singh. The incident in question is a case of version and cross version and it is yet to be adjudicated as to which party was aggressor. The allegations and counter-allegations leveled by both the parties are dependent upon evidence to be led before the Court. Hence, considering the afore-mentioned backdrop, keeping in view the fact that the applicant/accused is ready and willing to join investigation, this court is of the opinion that it is a fit case to direct the applicant/accused to join investigation. Accordingly, it is hereby directed that in the event of arrest of applicant/accused, he be released on bail to the satisfaction of Investigating Officer/Arresting Officer, subject to the following conditions:

- (i) that the applicant shall cooperate with the investigation and make himself available for interrogation whenever required;
- (ii) that the applicant shall not directly or indirectly make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the fact of the case so as to dissuade him/her from disclosing such facts to the court or to any police officer;
- (iii) that the applicant shall not obstruct or hamper the police investigation and not to play mischief with the evidence collected or yet to be collected by the police; and
- (iv) that the applicant be directed to furnish his undertaking in the shape of affidavit that in case he will change his residence or mobile number, he will intimate the changed address/mobile number to the Investigating Officer as well as the Court concerned during the pendency of trial.

It is clarified that none of the afore-cited observations be

construed as an expression of any opinion on the merits of the case. To come up on **06.03.2026** for awaiting report of Investigating Officer/SHO concerned. Police record be returned and be produced again on the date fixed.
