BAIL APPLICATION UNDER SECTION 483 of B.N.S.S.

ORDER

The above named accused has filed this application for the grant of regular bail under Section 483 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha

Sanhita, 2023 (hereinafter referred to as B.N.S.S.), in the afore referred F.I.R.

2. The very substance of the application being that accused/applicant had been falsely implicated in this case. He is innocent and has never committed any offence. No incriminating material has been recovered from the possession of the accused/applicant. False recovery had been foisted upon the accused-applicant.

3. Pursuant to the notice to the State, the learned Additional Public Prosecutor for the State contested the claim of the applicant on the ground that the accused/applicant is culpable under the stringent provisions of Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985 and consequently should be denied the concession of bail.

4. It was submitted by ASI Satnam Singh no.1005/TT, apart from present FIR, 14 other FIRs have been registered against accused and he has not been declared proclaimed offender in this case. Ahlmad has reported that this is the first bail application of accused. Apart from that, no other bail application is pending or decided by any Superior Court. Record was produced.

5. In this case, total 13 grams 65 milligrams grams of heroin along with drug money of Rs.1200/- is stated to have been recovered, out of that 13 grams 65 miligrams of heroin was recovered from accused/applicant and drug money of Rs.1200/- is

stated to have been recovered from the possession of co-accused Ajay Kumar alias Gulli. Challan is yet to be presented.

6. Further, keeping in view the law laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in '**Prabhakar Tewari Vs. State of U.P. and another**' 2020 (1) R.C.R. (Criminal 831) and '**Maulana Mohd. Amir Rashadi Vs State of U.P. and another**', 2012 ((2) SCC 382, the involvement of the petitioner in other cases would not be ground to refuse the concession of regular bail.

7. In view of the above said discussion and evidently, the recovered heroin falls within the range of intermediate quantity and is not commercial by any accounts. The accused/applicant is already in custody since 09.04.2026 and conclusion of trial will take its own course and time. No useful purpose would be served by detaining the accused indefinitely.

8. Hence in the peculiar circumstances, the accused-applicant is ordered to be released on ***bail*** on her furnishing bail bonds and surety bonds in the sum of Rs.50,000/- with one surety of the like amount, subject to the following conditions:

1. *That he shall attend the Court on each and every date of hearing;*
2. *That he shall not commit an offence similar to the offence of which he is accused, or suspected, of the commission of which he is suspected;*
3. *That he shall not directly or indirectly make an inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade him from disclosing such facts to the Court or to any police officer or tamper with the evidence; and*

4. That he shall not leave the country without prior permission of Court.

9. In view of the above, it is clarified that the observations made herein above are limited for the purpose of present proceedings and would not be construed as any opinion on the merits of the case. Papers be annexed with the main challan/record, if any otherwise be consigned to judicial record room. Police record be returned forthwith.
