



Criminal Misc. Application No. 243/2026

ORDER BELOW EXBT.C-1

(Delivered on this the 14th day of the month of August of the year 2026)

1. This application is filed by the applicant/Aamer Sayeedullah Khan concerned in F.No.: ARPT/AIU/NDPS/66/2026-AIU-O/o Commr-Cus-Goa seeking permission to travel outside the State.

2. It is the case of the applicant that he is an Indian Citizen, a resident of Mumbai, Maharashtra, where he resides with his family, including an ailing parent, his wife and a minor child. It is contended by the applicant that on 25.03.2026, the Applicant was falsely arrested at Manohar International Airport, Mopa, North Goa and implicated in a drug case bearing No. AIU/NDPS/66/2026, along with the accused; (1) Shri Tanmay Ramesh Jadhav, (2) Ms. Madhuri Vijay Naidu, and (3) Ms. Seema (4) Mr. Ansari Fahad Mohammad Sajid; in a case of recovery of 23.832 KG of Hydroponic weed (cannabis), wherein there stands Crime registered under F.No.: ARPT/AIU/NDPS/66/2026-AIU-O/o Commr-Cus-Goa before the Customs, Air Intelligence Unit, Manohar International Airport, Mopa, North Goa for offences punishable under Sections

20(b)(ii)(C), 23(c), 28, 29, 30, 35, 54 read with Section 8(c) of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act, 1985 and placed in judicial custody.

3. The Applicant has further pleaded that Bail Application No. 118/2026 filed before the Hon'ble Sessions Judge, North Goa, Merces was dismissed vide Order dated 14.05.2026. thereafter, he was granted bail in the present crime vide order dated 06.07.2026 passed by the Hon'ble High Court of Bombay at Goa in CRMAB/08/2026 and released on conditional bail including condition no.(v) whereby he is directed not to leave the territorial jurisdiction of Goa without the permission of the Trial Court.

4. It is further pleaded by the Applicant that since the day of his arrested on 25.03.2026, he has remained in Goa and has been unable to visit his family including an ailing parent, his wife and a minor child and therefore, his wife and minor child have temporarily moved to Goa in order to stay with him post his release from custody which has caused him financial losses as the family now has to reside in rented hotel lodges as they don't have any place to reside in Goa and has to incur daily expenses of his stay such as food and other utilities and it has also caused him a loss of his livelihood. Hence, the applicant has prayed for permission to travel to Mumbai i.e. Flat No. 401, 4th Floor, Mombatti Manzil, 47/51, Mohammed Umar Rajjab Road, Near Rehmani Masjid, Madanpura, Mumbai-400008, Mumbai Central, Maharashtra for a period of

three months and has also sought relaxation of the condition no. (iii) for a period of three months as it would be an onerous and expensive task to travel to Goa every other week.

5. The Applicant has pleaded that he has no criminal antecedents and has not been previously convicted of any offence under the NDPS Act or any other law. He has pleaded having deep roots in Mumbai and is not a flight risk. The Applicant is willing and ready to abide by all conditions that this Court may impose upon him if he is permitted to travel to Mumbai, Maharashtra. I have heard oral arguments by Ld. Adv. Shri J. Toraskar for the applicant who has submitted that the applicant will abide by all the conditions.

6. The Respondents were duly served and the IO has filed his reply objecting to said application on the ground that the bail was granted by the Hon'ble High Court of Bombay at Goa vide order dated 06.07.2026 in CRMAB No. 8/2026, subject to the conditions which inter alia, requires the Applicant not to leave the territorial jurisdiction of Goa without the permission of the Trial Court and further requires him to attend the Customs Officials at Custom House, Mormugao on every alternate Monday between 12.00 p.m. and 2.00 p.m. and to attend the Investigating Officer as and when required. It is further pleaded by the IO that the permission to travel to Mumbai and relaxation of condition no.(iii) has been sought primarily on the grounds of financial hardship and family

circumstances arising out of his continued stay in Goa. The said application has been objected on the ground that the investigation is at a crucial stage. It is further pleaded that the forensic examination of the mobile phones seized during the course of investigation has recently been completed and the extracted data is presently under examination and analysis by the Investigating Officer and depending upon the material emerging therefrom, further investigation, including examination of the Applicant and confrontation with the electronic evidence, may become necessary. Therefore, any relaxation of said conditions at this stage is likely to impede the smooth and expeditious completion of the investigation and may result in delay in securing the Applicant's presence whenever required. It is further pleaded that financial hardship and family circumstances, are personal in nature for the applicant and do not outweigh the requirements of a fair and effective investigation and therefore, prayed for dismissal of the application. Shri Anoop PS/IO has argued in line with his say. I have duly considered the rival contentions vis-à-vis the records.

7. I have perused the order dated 06.07.2026 passed by the Hon'ble High Court of Bombay at Goa in CRMAB/08/2026 granting conditional bail to the applicant. The bail conditions are reproduced below:-

- i) The Applicant be enlarged on bail, on executing PR Bond in the sum of Rs.1,00,000/- each with two

sureties in the like amount, to the satisfaction of the concerned Sessions Court;

- ii) The Applicant shall attend the trial court concerned on each and every date unless exempted by the orders of the Trial Court concerned.
- iii) The Applicant shall attend the Custom Officials of the Commissioner of Customs, Customs House, Mormugao, on every alternate Monday between 12.00 pm to 2.00 pm. He shall also attend the Investigating Officer as and when the Investigating Officer requires him to do so;
- iv) If the Applicant holds a passport, he shall deposit the same with the Custom Officials of the Commissioner of Customs, Customs House, Mormugao;
- v) The Applicant shall not leave the territorial jurisdiction of Goa without the permission of the Trial Court.
- vi) The Applicant shall not leave India without the permission of the Trial Court;

- vii) The Applicant shall not tamper with or attempt to influence or contact the Complainant, witnesses or any person concerned with the case;
- viii) The Applicant shall inform his latest place of residence and contact number immediately after being released and/or change of residence or mobile details, if any from time to time to the Court seized of the matter and to the Investigating Officer concerned;
- ix) The Applicant to cooperate with the conduct of the trial;
- x) Any infraction of the aforesaid conditions shall entail cancellation of bail.

8. In the said order, the applicant has been directed to seek permission from the Trial Court only in respect of condition no.(ii), (v) and (vi). Therefore, prayer for relaxation of condition no.(iii) cannot be decided by this Court and the applicant will have to approach the appropriate authority. As regards the permission sought to travel to Mumbai, Maharashtra for three months, has been objected by the IO since the presence of the applicant might be required for the purpose of confronting him with the electronic evidence and therefore, I am not inclined to grant the permission to travel since it is alleged that the applicant and co-accused were

running a crime syndicate in respect of the narcotic and psychotropic substances. Hence, the following order is passed:-

ORDER

The application filed by Aamer Sayeedullaha Khan concerned in F.No.: ARPT/AIU/NDPS/66/2026-AIU-O/o Commr-Cus-Goa seeking permission to travel outside the State and for relaxation of the conditions of the bail is dismissed.

Proceeding stands closed.
