ORDER:

This regular bail application has been moved on behalf of
applicant-accused Gurtej Singh @ Gogi for the offence punishable under
Section 22 of NDPS Act by virtue of Section 439 Cr.P.C.

2. Notice of this bail application has been given to the State. Police
record has been produced and perused and arguments have been heard.

3. As per allegations, on 26.05.2021 ASI Darshan Singh and other
police officials got secret information at about 12.15 PM that Gurtej Singh @
Gogi indulged in selling intoxicant tablets and on that he was going on foot
towards village Khurani to sell such tablets and he could be apprehended in

case nakabandi was held at the proper place. On the basis of that information case was registered against the accused and nakabandi was held by the concerned police officials and on that place one hindu person was seen coming from the side of village Ealwal and he was holding one polythene bag in his right hand and on seeing police party that person frightened and he threw away that polythene bag on road side. Certain strips of intoxicant tablets scattered on the road side. That person was apprehended on suspicion and he disclosed his name as Gurtej Singh @ Gogi. Upon counting those strips of intoxicant tablets these were found as 38 strips. Same were taken into possession.

4. It may be submitted that alleged recovery is that of 380 tablets of tramadol hydrochloride and assuming for a moment the actual weight of one of such tablets is 400mg, Even then such quantity of 380 tablets would come within the preview of non-commercial quantity. Therefore, applicant-accused is certainly entitled to the concession of interim bail and with this observation, bail applicant of applicant-accused is allowed and he is admitted to interim bail subject to his furnishing bail bond in the sum of Rs.1,00,000/- with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of Id. Illaqa Magistrate/Duty Magistrate, subject to following conditions:-

- 1 That applicant will appear in the Court on each and every date of hearing during trial without fail;
- 2 That applicant will not leave the Country without prior permission of the Court;
- 3 That applicant will not induce the prosecution witnesses as well as will not tamper the prosecution evidence, in any manner.

It is made clear that this concession of interim bail shall be reconsidered on

receipt of report of FSL. Police record be returned. Papers be attached with the connected papers of this case and accused shall appear on date fixed.
