

Umesh Kumar @ Ladi Vs. State

This order of mine shall dispose of an application moved on behalf of applicant/accused seeking grant of regular bail to him.

Ld. Counsel for applicant/accused-***Umesh Kumar @ Ladi*** has argued that the applicant/accused has been falsely implicated in the present FIR No.85, Dt. 07.03.2026 registered under Sections 115, 118(1), 118(2), 238 BNS, 2023 and Sections 27/61/85 of NDPS Act, PS Sadar Kharar (PP Gharuan). The applicant/accused is innocent and has not committed any offence as alleged in the present FIR. The applicant/accused has no concern or connection with the commission of any offence. The conclusion of the trial would take sufficient time, as such, no useful purpose would be served by keeping accused behind the bars. Therefore, prayer for allowing the present application has been made.

On the other hand, reply to the present bail application has been filed. Learned APP for the State has contested the present bail application on the ground that the applicant/accused has been booked for allegedly committing offence under Sections 115, 118(1), 118(2), 238 BNS and Sections 27/61/85 of NDPS Act, PS Sadar Kharar which are grave and serious in nature. Lastly, prayer for dismissal of the present bail application has been made.

Arguments heard on bail application. The perusal of the file shows that the present FIR has been registered under Sections 115, 118(1), 118(2), 238 BNS and Sections 27/61/85 of NDPS Act, PS Sadar Kharar against the applicant/accused **Umesh Kumar @ Ladi**. The allegations levelled against the accused are grave and serious in nature. Moreover, the contention of the Id. Counsel for the accused/applicant- **Umesh Kumar @ Ladi** that he has been falsely implicated in the present case is a matter of trial. One of the paramount before the grant of concession of bail to an accused is to see the interest of the General Public at large and to save the innocent persons from harassment and inconvenience. In view of above discussion, the applicant/accused **Umesh Kumar @ Ladi** is not entitled to the bail. Furthermore, there are likelihoods that the applicant/accused might misuse the concession of the bail.

In view of my above discussion, the present bail application is devoid of any merits and same is hereby dismissed. Hence, the present application stands disposed of. Papers be attached with the main file.
