This is an application u/s 483 of B.N.S.S. filed by the petitioner namely, Sk Mamid in c/w Kotwali P.S Case No.307/2026 dtd 25.05.2026 u/s. 297/318(4)/336(3)/338/61(2)/ of BNS and 7(3) of Lotteries Registration Act.

Ld. advocate for the petitioner/petitioners submitted that no bail application has either been filed before any Higher Court or any such bail petition has been rejected.

Ld. Advocate for the petitioner submitted that this accused / petitioner is in custody since 25.05.2026 and co-accused persons are on bail. So, considering the detention of the accused he may be granted bail on any terms and conditions.

Ld. P.P. in-charge produces the case diary and leaves the adjudication of the case to the discretion of the Court by pointing out the matters available in the case diary.

Heard the Ld. Advocate and Ld. P.P. in-charge.

Perused the petition, CD and other materials in case record.

On perusal of the materials available in the CD, it appears that the present accused / petitioner is languishing in judicial custody since 25.05.2026. It further appears at page Nos. 267 and 268 in the CD that co-accused persons are on the same footing, have already been enlarged on bail. Therefore, further detention of the accused is not necessary for further investigation. Accordingly, the petition for bail is considered and allowed **with a condition upon the petitioner to meet the I.O once in a fortnight till submission of charge sheet and also with a condition that he shall co-operate with the investigating agency and he shall not tamper any evidence and influence the witnesses.**

The petitioner named above may find bail of Rs. 2,000/- with 2 sureties of Rs.1,000/- each subject to the satisfaction of the Ld. CJM, Paschim Medinipur.

Misc case is disposed of. CD/TCR, if any, be returned.
