

State Vs Komalpreet Singh @ Komal (BA No.20/2026)
FIR No.16 dated 24.01.2026
Under Section 21, 61, 85 of NDPS
Police Station Lakho Ke Behram

1. Police Record produced.
2. Heard on the bail application filed by accused/applicant Komalpreet Singh @ Komal through counsel on the ground that nothing has been recovered from accused/applicant and accused/applicant has not committed any offence as mentioned in the FIR. No independent witness has ever been joined by the police though the same was available near the alleged place of recovery which is a public place. Accused/applicant is in judicial custody since 24.01.2026 and he is no more required by the police for further investigation. It will take a long time for presentation of challan and conclusion of trial of this case. Hence the present bail application.
3. Notice of the said bail application was given to the State through Ld. APP for the State, who did not file any separate reply to the said bail application but orally opposed the application on the ground that accused/applicant is not entitled for bail. A prayer was made to dismiss the present bail application.
4. After hearing the contentions raised by the Ld. APP for the State and Ld. counsel for the accused and taking into consideration the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the present case that the accused/applicant is in custody and as such, without going through the merits of this case, the present application for regular bail filed by the

accused/applicant under Section 21, 61, 85 of NDPS Act stands allowed and disposed of and accused/applicant is ordered to be released on bail subject to his furnishing bail bonds in the sum of Rs.30,000/- with one surety in the like amount, subject to fulfillment of following conditions:-

1. That such person shall not directly or indirectly make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade him from disclosing such facts to the court or to any police officer or tamper with the evidence.
2. That such person shall inform the Court in case of change of his address immediately without any delay.
3. That such persons shall not leave the country without the prior permission of the court.
4. That he shall furnish his e-mail ID and mobile number to the investigating officer and any message sent to him through e-mail or SMS shall be treated as service of notice on them to join the investigation or to appear before the court.

Bail bonds and surety bonds furnished which are accepted and attested. Release warrants be issued immediately. Papers are ordered to be attached with remand papers/file.
