

## LALIT PAWAR Vs PUNJAB STATE

Heard, on the application moved by counsel for the accused Lalit Pawar for bail. It is averred in the application that the accused is innocent and has not committed any offence. He further stated that the accused was regularly appearing before this Hon'ble Court however the police of District Fatehgarh Sahib had illegally detained the applicant in some false case, as such the accused/applicant absented from the Court proceeding and could not appear regularly before the Court. The learned counsel for the accused has prayed that the bail application filed on behalf of accused/applicant may kindly be allowed and accused may kindly be released on bail.

The bail application has been opposed by the Ld. APP stating that the same is not maintainable and he prayed that the bail application moved by accused may kindly be dismissed.

This Court has heard the learned counsel for the applicant/accused and Ld. APP for the State and perused the case file very carefully. Perusal of the original file reveals that the applicant/accused Lalit Pawar got absented in the court proceedings on 15.12.2017 and thereafter, he was summoned throughailable warrants as well as through nonailable warrants. Thereafter, proclamation proceeding against him was completed on 16.03.2018 by the Predecessor of this Court. During this period, neither his counsel nor anyone else has appeared on behalf of him or moved any application. Now the accused Paramjit Singh has been produced by the jail authorities before the Court on 07.07.2018. In view of this Court, the applicant/accused has willfully absented from the proceedings of this Court, the accused has jumped the bail granted to him and has misused the concession of bail. Moreover, the offences in the present case are of serious nature. Keeping in view the seriousness of the offences in nature, this Court is not to incline to take lenient view against the applicant/accused Lalit Pawar. This Court is of the considered opinion

that the applicant/accused is not entitled to bail. As such, the instant bail application of the applicant/accused Lalit Pawar stands declined. Papers be attached with the original file.
