

Mat Suit No. 1138 of 2025

(CIS No.521 of 2025, CNR No.WBWM01-008841-2025, J.O. Code No.WB 01301)

Order No. 03, dated 22.05.2026.

Today is fixed for hearing for reconciliation failing which for hearing of the case if not withdrawn in the meantime.

Both the petitioners namely, Raghu Thapa and Sakila Thapa are present before the Court by filing respective haziran with their Ld. Advocates. Parties have filed and tendered their evidences-in-chief through affidavit and also examined, before the Court on oath as P.W.1 and P.W.2 and discharged. On behalf of the petitioners, their respective Aadhaar Cards are marked as Exhibit-1 and Exhibit-2.

Heard both the petitioners personally.

Perused the documents and evidences adduced by the parties.

It appears that the marriage in between the petitioner No. 1 and petitioner No. 2 was solemnized on 06.12.1988 according to Hindu Rites and Custom and thereafter, the parties lived together as husband and wife but since 05.04.2000 they have been living separately and that they have not been able to live together and that they have mutually agreed that the marriage should be mutually dissolved and as such they have approached before this Court by filing this case on 30.08.2025 for divorce on mutual consent.

Having regard to under section 13B of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 and on the motion of both the parties made today after six months from the date of presentation of the aforesaid case, it appears that the statutory prohibitory period for filing this case has been elapsed. It also appears to me that the Matrimonial Tie between the parties has been broken to such an extent that their co-existence is practically impossible and as such I am inclined to pass order accordingly.

In the result, the suit succeeds. C.F paid is correct.

Hence, it is,

Ordered

that the Matrimonial Suit be and the same is hereby allowed on mutual consent in terms of the petition U/sec. 13B of Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 and the marriage solemnized between the parties on 06.12.1988 according to Hindu Rites and Customs stands dissolved by a decree of divorce on mutual consent with effect from the date of this order.
