	16.04.2026	<u>RNT,J & BM,J</u> On 30.03.2026, we passed the following order: <i>Heard Sri S.V. Muni Reddy, learned counsel for the petitioner/defendant, and Ms. A. Priyanka, learned counsel representing Sri Sai Sanjay Suraneni, learned counsel for the respondents/plaintiffs.</i> <i>2. In C.O.S. No. 14 of 2023, pending on the file of the Special Court for Trial and Disposal of Commercial Disputes, Vijayawada, filed by the respondents/plaintiffs, the petitioner/defendant filed I.A. No. 364 of 2025 seeking to receive the documents mentioned in the list of documents appended to the affidavit (at page Nos. 15 to 18). The said application was rejected by the learned Special Judge by order dated 02.01.2026. Challenging the order dated 02.01.2026, the present Civil Revision Petition has been filed.</i> <i>3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner had also filed C.O.S. No. 17 of 2022 (so numbered upon transfer from the learned Civil Court), wherein certain documents were filed and marked as Exs. A1 to A80, and that the documents now sought to be produced in C.O.S. No. 14 of 2023 are the very same documents. He submits that the application ought not to have been rejected, particularly when certified copies of those documents are sought to be placed on record in the present suit.</i> <i>4. On a perusal of the affidavit filed before the learned Special Judge, it appears that, insofar as the list of documents is concerned, there is no specific mention that the documents listed at Sl. Nos. 1 to 29 correspond to the documents already marked as exhibits in C.O.S. No. 17 of 2022.</i> <i>5. Learned counsel on both sides submit that the claim for recovery of money by either side is the subject matter of both suits, i.e., C.O.S. No. 17 of 2022 filed by the present petitioner and C.O.S. No. 14 of 2023 filed by the respondents.</i>	

		6. Let an affidavit be filed furnishing full particulars of the documents sought to be filed vide I.A.No.364 of 2025 in C.O.S. No. 14 of 2023, specifically indicating the exhibit numbers of those documents as marked in C.O.S. No. 17 of 2022. 7. List on 06.04.2025. 2. Pursuant thereto, the petitioner has filed the affidavit. 3. The petitioner filed I.A.No.364 of 2025, seeking to receive the documents mentioned in the list appended thereto and I.A.No.363 of 2025, for adducing evidence, in COS.No.14 of 2023 and both applications were rejected by a common order dated 02.01.2026. Learned counsel re-submitted today also, as was submitted previously that those were the certified copies of the documents of which the originals have already been filed in C.O.S.No.17 of 2022 between the same parties and both the suits are pending in the same Court. 4. Learned counsel for the petitioner placed reliance on the case of <i>C-Star Engineers and Contractors (C-180), represented by its proprietor v. IDMC Limited, represented by its Managing Director and others</i>¹. 5. Sri D.Prudhvi Teja, learned counsel representing Sri Sai Sanjay Suraneni, learned counsel appearing for the respondents, prays for two weeks time, to file the counter affidavit in both the petitions, as also the response affidavit to the affidavit filed by the petitioner dated 06.04.2026.
