The Court made the following:

ORDER:

The Writ Petition has been filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India seeking the following relief:-

“...to issue a writ order or direction more particularly one in the nature of WRIT OF MANDAMUS to declare inaction of the 2nd and 3rd respondent not directing the 4th respondent to defreeze the bank account no 4090018008521 which has been freezed in pursuance of mail dt 23 04 2024 sent by the 2nd and 3rd respondent herein eventhough the cyber compliant also closed still the petitioner enterprises bank account is freezed as illegal arbitrary and unjust and in violation of rights guaranteed under Articles 14 19 and 21 of constitution of India and in violation of Principals of Natural Justice and pass....”

2. Heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and the learned Assistant Government Pleader.

3. Mr. Puli Vishnu Vardhan, the learned counsel for the petitioner, submits that the inaction of respondent Nos.2 and 3 in not directing the 4th respondent to defreeze Bank Account No.4090018008521, which was frozen in pursuance of the mail dated 23.04.2024 sent by respondent Nos.2 and 3, even though the cyber complaint has been closed, is illegal, and the petitioner's enterprise bank account still remains frozen.

4. Sri P. Ajay Babu, learned Assistant Government Pleader, on written instructions, submits, by producing a letter dated 30.03.2026, that the Inspector of Police, Kavali I Town Police Station, has addressed a letter to respondent No. 4 to defreeze the account of the petitioner and to unfreeze the lien amount.

5. Considering the entire facts and circumstances of the case, and recording the submissions of the learned Assistant Government Pleader, in view of the grievance of the petitioner being addressed by respondent No.2, nothing remains in this Writ Petition.

6. In the result, the Writ Petition is disposed of. There shall be no order as to costs.

As a sequel, Miscellaneous petitions, if any pending, shall stand closed.
