The learned counsel for the petitioner is permitted to take out personal notices to the respondent Nos.8 and 9 and proof of service shall be filed within a period of three (03) weeks from today. This writ petition is filed questioning the action of the respondent Nos.3 to 7 along with the unofficial respondent No.9 in interfering and trespassing with the peaceful possession and enjoyment of the petitioner's Schedule Property. The learned Senior Counsel for the petitioner submits that pursuant to the letter of the 2nd respondent dated 04.12.2025 addressed to the respondent Nos.7, 3 and others, the respondent authorities concerned are trying to meddle with the land of the petitioner for the purpose of carrying out the national energy	Contd..,

		mission. In that process, the petitioner's land is being surveyed and dealt with for the available oil and gas exploration purposes. Unless the petitioner is informed prior to the taking of necessary steps by the respondent authorities concerned in that regard, it would suffer severe loss and hardship as their machinery and equipment are lying in the said premises. On the other hand, the learned Assistant Government Pleader relying upon the written instructions of the 5th respondent dated 20.03.2026 submits that the proposed activity is only temporary and non-invasive survey which does not involve acquisition, dispossession or disturbance of ownership rights. The official respondents have already informed the 9th respondent that any survey operation shall be conducted only after giving prior notice to the petitioner by following the due procedure and ensuring that no damage is caused. In view of the above said facts and circumstances, recording the said instructions of the 5th respondent dated 20.03.2026, no further orders are necessary to be passed at present.
