Petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India, is filed praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed therewith, the High Court may be pleased to issue a Writ more particularly one in the nature of Writ of Mandamus, declaring the action of the Respondent No.2 herein in passing an Externment Order against the Petitioner herein vide REV - CSEC0EXT(PRC)/3/2025 - SA(C1) - COLLKRNL dated 25.03.2026 as being illegal, arbitrary, unjust, irrational, baseless, violative of principles of Natural Justice, vitiated by non application of mind, vitiated by consideration of

irrelevant material, violative of the provisions of the Andhra Pradesh Prevention of Anti Social and Hazardous Act, 1980 and violative of Articles 14, 19 (1)(d), 19 (1)(g) and 21 of the Constitution of India, consequently set aside the same;

Petition under Section 151 CPC., is filed praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed in support of the petition, the High Court may be pleased to stay the operation of the Externment Order issued by the Respondent No.2 against the Petitioner herein *vide* REV - CSEC0EXT(PRC)/3/2025 - SA(C1) - COLLKRNL dated 25.03.2026;

The petition coming on for hearing, upon perusing the Petition and the affidavit filed in support thereof and upon hearing the arguments of Sri. VIVEKANANDA VIRUPAKSHA, Advocate for the Petitioner and of GP FOR HOME for the Respondent Nos.1, 3 & 4 and of GP FOR REVENUE, for the Respondent No.2;

The Court made the following ORDER:

Heard the learned counsel for the petitioner.

Heard learned Assistant Government Pleader in part.

It is not disputed in the impugned order that, in the preceding six months prior to passing of the order of externment, there are three offences alleged to have been committed by the petitioner, which are enumerated in sub-clauses (i) to (v) of clause (e) of Section 2 of the Hazardous Activities Act, 1980. Therefore, there shall be a stay of all further proceedings in REV-CSEC0EXT(PRC)/3/2025-SA(C1)-COLLKRNL, dated 25.03.2026, passed by the Collector and District Magistrate, Kurnool/respondent No.2.
