Petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed therewith, the High Court may be pleased to issue a Writ, order or direction, more particularly one in the nature of Writ of Mandamus, declaring the action of the respondents in not considering the case of the petitioner for appointment to the post of Junior

Plant Attendant earmarked for BC(A) community the cut off marks of which are 75.71 marks and as the petitioner secured 79.39 marks and he is fully qualified and eligible to be appointed in BC(A) Category and non-consideration of his case in the said category is totally arbitrary, irregular, illegal and against Articles 14, 16 and 19 of the Constitution of India and consequently direct the respondents to appoint the petitioners as Junior Plant Attendant as per his merit and ranking obtained in the competitive examinations as per Notification No.1 /CGM/HR/ 2010 dated 05.01.2011 and also consequential Notification dated 17.10.2011 in the category of BC(A); and pass such other order or orders as this Honourable Court may deem fit and proper in the circumstances of the case.

IA NO: 1 OF 2013(WPMP 27125 OF 2013)

Petition under Section 151 CPC praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed in support of the petition, the High Court may be pleased to direct the respondents to consider the case of the petitioner for appointment to the Post of Junior Plant Attendant under BC(A) Category [Non-Local] as per his merit by directing the respondents not to fill up one vacancy in the category BC(A) (Non-local), pending disposal of the Writ Petition; and pass such other order or orders as this Honourable Court may deem fit and proper in the circumstances of the case.

IA NO: 1 OF 2015(WPMP 7836 OF 2015)

Petition under Section 151 CPC praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed in support of the petition, the High Court may be pleased to direct the respondents to consider the case of the petitioner for appointment as Junior Plant Attendant (Diesel Mechanic) under BC(A) Category as per merit and ranking after causing necessary changes in respect of community, pending disposal of the above Writ Petition

Order:-

There is no representation for the petitioner.

2. The learned Standing Counsel appearing for the respondents submits that the petitioner had applied for the post of Junior Plant Attendant in pursuance of the notification issued on 05.01.2011. It is submitted that the petitioner had applied by considering himself as a candidate belonging to O.C. community, and a hall ticket was also issued accordingly. It is further submitted that, after the conduct of the examination and declaration of the results, the petitioner submitted a representation seeking consideration under the BC-A category. It is also submitted that the recruitment process, in pursuance of the said notification, has been completed and that this Court did not grant any interim order while admitting the writ petition.

3. Considering the submissions that the recruitment process has been completed, and that the petitioner had applied as a candidate belonging to the O.C. community, the further request made by the petitioner, after declaration of the results, to consider him under the BC-A category cannot be entertained.

4. Accordingly, this Writ Petition is dismissed. There shall be no order as to costs.

As a sequel, miscellaneous petitions pending, if any, shall stand closed.
