WHEREAS the Petitioner above named through his Advocate Sri G V SHIVAJI presented this Petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India is filed praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed

therewith, the High Court may be pleased to issue a writ, order or direction more particularly one in the nature of Writ of Mandamus, declaring the impugned action of the respondents in not considering the petitioner for the post of Assistant Professor in pursuance of Notification No.2/2023, dated 14.07.2023, inspite of petitioner producing school study certificates to comply with local candidate status and further submitting Phd. Marks memo though the vacancies earmarked under EWS category are vacant, in which petitioner is entitled to be selected and appointed as illegal arbitrary and violative of Article 14 and Article 16 of the Constitution of India and also violative of principles of natural justice, apart from principle laid down by Hon'ble Supreme Court in Dolly Chhanda Vs. Chairman, JEE and Ors, reported in (2005) 9 SCC 779, consequently direct the respondents to consider the petitioner for selection and appointment for the post of Assistant Professor against the existing vacancies as per Notification No.2/2023, dated 14.07.2023, by accepting the school study certificates produced by petitioner and Phd marks memo submitted by petitioner against the existing vacancies notified in Notification No.2/2023, dated 14.07.2023, on par with all other candidates selected and appointed as per the Notification No.2/2023, dated 14.07.2023, in the interest of Justice;

AND WHEREAS the High Court upon perusing the petition and memorandum of grounds filed herein and upon hearing the arguments of Sri G V SHIVAJI Advocate for the Petitioner, Additional Solicitor General of India for R1, GP for Medical and Health for R2, R4 and R5, Sri S.Vivek Chandra Sekhar for R3 directed issue of notice to the Respondents herein to show cause as to why this WRIT PETITION should not be admitted.
