The Court made the following:

ORDER:

This Writ Petition is filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India seeking the following relief:

“to issue an appropriate Writ Order or Direction more particularly one in the nature of Writ of Mandamus by declaring the action of the respondents in not extending the remuneration of petitioners on par with contractual appointees who appointed in identical posts and as was considered similar persons by considering the orders passed in WP No 16237 OF 2023 dated 20 11 2025 to an identical persons as highly illegal arbitrary discriminatory and against the Article 14 16 and 21 of Constitution of India and consequently direct the respondents to extend the remuneration on par with similarly situated persons whereas extended as per the orders passed in WP No 16237 OF 2023 dated 20 11 2025 and pass...”

1. Heard the learned counsel for the petitioners and the learned Government Pleader for the respondents.
2. The Contention of the petitioners is that they were appointed on an outsourcing basis and they request on par with contractual appointees who were appointed in identical posts, and that similarly situated persons were granted such benefit in terms of the orders passed in W.P.No.16237 of 2023, dated 20.11.2025.
3. Therefore, the petitioner are held to be entitled for the remuneration to their posts as mentioned in the Proceedings of Respondent No.2 issued vide Rc.No.4077/P1?2020, dated 29.06.2020 and in the recruitment notification issued by Respondent No.4 vide Rc.No.100/GMC/ATP/2020, dated 13.07.2020 as there cannot be any variance to the remuneration of same work. The Respondents shall pay the enhanced remuneration with

effect from the date of Judgment and relief sought by Petitioners from the date of appointment is declined as that would be affect the budgets sanctioned for maintenance and development of Respondent No.4-Hospital, which is for the betterment of patients.

4. Accordingly, the Writ Petition is disposed of directing, the Respondents are directed to pay remuneration to the petitioners as mentioned to the respective posts in Rc.No.4077/P1/2020, dated 29.06.2020 issued by Respondent No.2 and Recruitment Notification issued by Respondent No.4 vide R.C.No.100/GMC/ATP2020, dated 13.07.2020 with effect from today. No orders as to costs.

Consequently, Miscellaneous Petitions, if any, pending in the writ petition shall stand closed.
