Petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India is filed praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed therewith, the High Court may be pleased issue a writ, order or direction more particularly one in the nature of writ of Mandamus to declare the action of the Respondents No. 1 and 2 in interfering with the civil dispute between the Petitioner and the Respondent No.5 without following due process of law and compelling the Petitioner to accept the illegal demand from the Respondent No.5 and further directing the Respondent No.5 to keep his lorries in front of the gate of the Petitioner's Company and thereby preventing the vehicles to entire into the factory premises

restraining the Petitioner from doing business activities as arbitrary, illegal and in violation of Article 14 and 21 of the Constitution of India and consequently direct the Respondents No.1 and 2 not to interfere with the civil disputes between the Petitioner and Respondent no.5 without following due process of law and further direct the Respondents No.1 and 2 to initiate criminal prosecution against the Respondent No.5 for committing the offences of extortion and wrongful restraint and take further action for removal of the parked vehicles in front of the Gates of the Petitioner Company by the Respondent No.5 in the interest of justice.

IA NO: 1 OF 2026

Petition under Section 151 CPC is filed praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed in support of the petition, the High Court may be pleased to direct the Respondents No. 1 and 2 to take action for removal of Lorries kept by the Respondent no.5 in front of the Gates of the Petitioner Company enabling the Petitioner to run the business, Pending disposal of WP 10597 of 2026, on the file of the High Court.

The petition/Appeal coming on for hearing, upon perusing the Petition and the affidavit filed in support thereof and upon hearing the arguments of SRI P NAGENDRA REDDY Advocate for the Petitioner, and the Court made the following.

ORDER

"It is submitted that Respondent No.2 is unnecessarily interfering in the civil dispute pending between the Petitioner and Respondent No.5.

The Respondent No.5 has paid sum amount to the Petitioner towards the transaction of hollow bricks.

The Inspector of Police, Jaggaiahpet Circle shall appear before this Court on 27.04.2026.
