Petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed therewith, the High Court may be pleased to issue a Writ, order or direction more particularly one in the nature of Writ of Mandamus, declaring the action of the 3rd and 4th respondents not allotting employee CFMS ID through Nidhi Portal for sanction and releasing the pay and allowances (salary) and other benefits to the petitioner even though the petitioner discharging her duties as Public Health Worker on Compassionate Grounds from 23.01.2025 as highly illegal, arbitrary, unjust, and contrary to service rules and violation of Article 14, 16 and 21 of the Constitution of India and consequently direct the 3rd and 4th respondents to allot CFMS ID to the petitioner and to release salary to the petitioner from 23.01.2025 with all consequential benefits and pas

The Court made the following Order:

The present writ petition is filed questioning the action of the respondents in not allotting employee CFMS ID through NIDHI Portal for sanction and releasing the pay and allowances (salary) and other benefits to the petitioner even though the petitioner discharging her duties as Public Health Worker on Compassionate Grounds from 23.01.2025 as illegal and arbitrary.

2. Heard learned counsel for the petitioner and learned Government Pleader appearing for the respondents.

3. The petitioner was appointed by the 5th respondent vide orders dated 22.01.2025 and since then the petitioner discharging her duties as Public Health Worker. Despite the requests made by the petitioner, the 4th respondent has not considered and not allotted the CFMS ID and in view of the said action the 5th respondent is not able to pay the salaries to the petitioners.

4. Considering the said submissions, the Writ Petition is disposed of directing the 4th respondent to consider the correspondence made by the 5th respondent dated 09.12.2025 and pass appropriate orders within a period of one month from the date

of receipt of this order. It is needless to mention that the 4th respondent may not take any objection with regard to petitioner on the ground that she is a married daughter because the identical issue has been considered by the Division Bench of this Court and held that the petitioner therein/ married daughter is also entitled for compassionate appointment. There shall be no order as to costs.

As a sequel, pending miscellaneous petitions, if any, shall stand closed.
