

THE HON'BLE SRI JUSTICE RAVI CHEEMALAPATI**CIVIL REVISION PETITION NOS.1139 and 1165 of 2025****COMMON ORDER:**

Aggrieved by the separate orders dated 29.11.2024 passed in Interlocutory Application Nos.472 of 2024 and 59 of 2020 in Original Suit No.01 of 2017 on the file of the Court of Civil Judge (Senior Division) Avanigadda, Krishna District, CRP No.1139 of 2025 and 1165 of 2025 are filed respectively.

2. After arguing at length, Sri A.Syam Sundar Reddy, learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that there were several mistakes and lapses on the part of the plaintiff, who had not been properly advised and had filed unnecessary interlocutory applications, thereby creating confusion. He prayed to permit the petitioner to withdraw I.A.Nos.472 of 2024 and 59 of 2020 with a liberty to file fresh Interlocutory Applications and seek amendment of the plaint before the trial Court.

3. In response, Sri Ghantasala Udaya Bhaskar, learned counsel for the respondent contended that the parties should also be more diligent in filing applications before the trial Court. However, he fairly submitted that appropriate orders may be passed in order to meet the ends of justice.

4. Perusal of the record shows that the plaintiff had filed Interlocutory Applications one after another seeking amendment of the plaint, which created considerable confusion. However, on account of such mistakes,

the rights of the parties should not be affected. Hence, this Court, without going into the merits of the case and in order to meet the ends of justice, is inclined to grant liberty to the petitioner to file a consolidated amendment application before the trial Court, subject to payment of certain costs.

5. Accordingly, the Civil Revision Petitions are disposed of granting liberty to the petitioner/plaintiff to withdraw the Interlocutory Application Nos.472 of 2024 and 59 of 2020 on the file of the Court of Civil Judge (Senior Division), Avanigadda. Consequently, the said applications are dismissed as withdrawn granting liberty to the petitioner/plaintiff to file fresh Interlocutory application seeking amendment of the plaint, if so advised. In the event such application is filed, the trial Court shall consider and dispose of the same on its own merits and in accordance with law, without being influenced by the observations made in this order. The plaintiff is directed to pay costs of Rs.5,000/- to the defendant within a period of two (2) weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this order. There shall be no order as to costs.

Consequently, miscellaneous petitions, if any, shall stand closed.
